SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL

SENATE 585

An Act amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, establishing the Pennsylvania Dairy Future Commission and providing for its powers and duties. (Senators CORMAN, VOGEL, SCARNATI and others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, June 18, 2019

CO VOTE

This bill creates the PA Dairy Future Commission.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILL

309

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, June 12, 2019

OVER

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILL

HOUSE **239**

An Act amending the act of June 27, 1991 (P.L.70, No.10), entitled "An act requiring the superintendent of every public school district to make available, upon request, lists of graduating seniors to armed forces recruiters; and providing a penalty for the misuse of any such lists," further providing for title and for legislative intent; providing for short title and for definitions; and further providing for list of seniors to be compiled, for optional compliance by nonpublic schools and for reimbursement of costs. (Representatives READSHAW, MURT, JAMES and others) - Education, May 13, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for list of seniors to be compiled, for optional compliance by nonpublic schools and for reimbursement of costs.

SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, May 13, 2019 13

OVER

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILL

HOUSE 1222

An Act amending Title 10 (Charities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, consolidating the Solicitation of Funds for Charitable Purposes Act and the Institutions of Purely Public Charity Act; and making related repeals. (Representatives LEWIS, MILLARD, BERNSTINE and others) - Finance, June 18, 2019 1



This bill amends Title 10 regarding Charities Code.

SECOND CONSIDERATION GAME AND FISHERIES BILLS

301

An Act amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in hunting and furtaking, further providing for penalties. (Representatives MULLERY, BERNSTINE, HILL-EVANS and others) – Game & Fisheries, June 18, 2019 1

OVER

This bill amends Title 34 to provide penalties.

SECOND CONSIDERATION GAME AND FISHERIES BILLS

HOUSE 1188 1385

An Act amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in hunting and furtaking, further providing for unlawful devices and methods. (Representatives WENTLING, READSHAW, METCALFE and others) – Game & Fisheries, June 18, 2010

C

This bill amends Title 34 to remove the restriction on the use of thermal and night vision optics for hunting.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

HOUSE

An Act providing for health insurance coverage requirements for stage four, advanced metastatic cancer. (Representatives BENNINGHOFF, BARRAR, BERNSTINE and others) - Health, May 22, 2019

OVER

This bill is a freestanding act which addresses treatment of stage four, advanced metastatic cancer.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 111

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, SIMS and others) - Judiciary, June 18, 2019

OVER

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

SENATE

947

1630

An Act amending the act of November 29, 2006 (P.L.1471, No.165), known as the Sexual Assault Testing and Evidence Collection Act, further providing for sexual assault evidence collection program, for rights of sexual assault victims and for report by Pennsylvania State Police. (Senators LANGERHOLC, FOLMER, MARTIN and others) – Judiciary, June 18, 2019

This bill amends the Sexual Assault Testing and Evidence Collection Act to expand the current list of rights for survivors of sexual assault to address anonymous submissions of sexual assault evidence and submissions for which jurisdiction is unknown.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

SENATE 469

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in depositions and 476 witnesses, providing for procedures to protect victims and witnesses with intellectual disabilities or autism. (Senators LAUGHLIN, BAKER, MENSCH and others) - Judiciary, June 18, 2019



This bill creates a new subchapter in Title 42 entitled Victims and Witness with Intellectual Disabilities or Autism.

SENATE 479

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in depositions and witnesses, further providing for admissibility of certain statements. (Senators BAKER, FONTANA, MARTIN and others) - Judiciary, June 18, 2019

VOTE



This bill amends Title 42 to add a number of crimes to the existing provision which permits a court to admit an out-of-court statement of a child victim or child witness.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILLS

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for 856 definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) - Labor & Industry, May 8, 2019


OVER

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

HOUSE

1537

An Act amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment Compensation 1936 Law, in contributions by employers and employees, further providing for contributions by employees. (Representatives HARKINS, COX, SCHLOSSBERG and others) - Rules, June 12, 2019 3



This bill amends the Unemployment Compensation Law to provide additional flexibility for the scheduled drawdown of dollars allocated for the Benefit Modernization project.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE 1074 1614

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class. (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) – Local Government, June 17, 2019 2

OVER

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

THIRD CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE 1037

An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and for application; and, in exemptions, applicability and penalties, further providing for penalties. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, May 15, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

THIRD CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

HOUSE 1005 2022

An Act amending the act of October 27, 2014 (P.L.2911, No.191), known as the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program (ABC-MAP) Act, further providing for purpose, for definitions, for powers and duties of board and for establishment of program and providing for requirements for first responder agencies and hospital emergency departments and for requirements for coroners and medical examiners. (Representatives COX, BERNSTINE, BROWN and others) – Appropriations, June 10, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program Act to include the administration of naloxone in apatient's record on the ABC-MAP databasde.

THIRD CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

HOUSE 1283

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in judgments and other liens, further providing for exemption of particular property. (Representatives MOUL, PICKETT, RYAN and others) - Appropriations, June 03, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached 8

OVER

This bill amends Title 40 and Title 42 to provide consumer protections for annuity benefit plans.

THIRD CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILL

HOUSE 196

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, organizing the Judiciary into representative districts and further providing for residency requirements.
