SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILLS

309

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, June 12, 2019

OVER

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

HOUSE 1634

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in support matters generally, further providing for costs and fees and for State disbursement unit. (Representative BOBACK) - Rules, June 20, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 23 in Support Matters to increase the fee for child support collection services.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **EDUCATION BILL**

HOUSE 239

An Act amending the act of June 27, 1991 (P.L.70, No.10), entitled "An act requiring the superintendent of every public school district to make available, upon request, lists of graduating seniors to armed forces recruiters; and providing a penalty for the misuse of any such lists," further providing for title and for legislative intent; providing for short title and for definitions; and further providing for list of seniors to be compiled, for optional compliance by nonpublic schools and for reimbursement of costs. (Representatives READSHAW, MURT, JAMES and others) - Education, June 24, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for list of seniors to be compiled, for optional compliance by nonpublic schools and for reimbursement of costs.

SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

HOUSE 247

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, June 24, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

SECOND CONSIDERATION GAME AND FISHERIES BILL

HOUSE 301

An Act amending Title 34 (Game) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in hunting and furtaking, further providing 404 forpenalties. (Representatives MULLERY, BERNSTINE, HILL-EVANS and others) - Game & Fisheries, June 18, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 34 to provide penalties.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILL

HOUSE

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and 1630 adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, and others) - Judiciary, June 18, 2019

OVER

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE **785**

An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), 856 known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) - Labor & Industry, June 20, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class. (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) - Local Government, June 17, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILLS

SENATE 698

An Act amending the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), known as the Medical Practice Act of 1985, further 1026 providing for definitions, for physician assistants and for physician assistant license. (Senators GORDNER, FARNESE, SCHWANK and others) - Professional Licensure, June 24, 2019

This bill amends the Medical Practice Act to authorize a supervising physician assistant to designate another person to their application for a written agreement.

SENATE 699

An Act amending the act of October 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, No.261), known as the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act, further providing 1027 for physician assistants. (Senators GORDNER, FARNESE, SCHWANK and others) - Professional Licensure, June 24, 2019

VOTE



This bill amends the Osteopathic Medical Practice Act to authorize a supervising physician and a physician assistant to designate another person to prepare and submit their application for a written agreement.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILLS

SENATE 48

An Act amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), 1037 know as the Pennsylvania Election Code, in ballots, further providing for form of official election ballot and for number of ballots to be printed and specimen ballots; in voting machines, further providing for requirements of voting machines and for form of ballot labels on voting machines; in electronic voting systems, further providing for requirements of electronic voting systems, for forms and for election day procedures and the process of voting; providing for voting systems decertification; in preparation for and conduct of primaries and elections, further providing for instructions of voters and manner of voting in districts in which voting machines are used, for count and return of votes in districts in which ballots are used and for what ballots shall be counted, manner of counting and defective ballots; and, in voting by qualified absentee electors, further providing for date of application for absentee ballot, for approval of application for absentee ballot, for voting by absentee electors and for canvassing of official absentee ballots. (Senators GORDNER, FOLMER, LANGERHOLC and others) - State Government, June 24, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 25 to prohibit the Commonwealth from decertifying voting systems in 50% or more of the state's counties until the General Assembly is notified of the plan for replacing the voting systems and the estimated cost of replacement, and a legislative commission is established to review the plan, hold hearings and issue a report.

SENATE 130

An Act authorizing the Department of General Services, with the approval of the Governor, to release a portion of the use restriction and reversionary interest affecting certain real property situate partly in the Township of Mahoning and partly in the Danville, County of Montour. GORDNER) - State Government, June 24, 2019

This bill authorizes the release of agricultural land use restrictions on a parcel of land in the Borough of Danville and the Township of Mahoning, Montour County.

SENATE 701

An Act authorizing and directing the Department of General Services, with the approval of the Governor, to grant and convey certain lands and improvements sites in the convey certain lands and improvements situate in the City of Allentown and the City of Bethlehem, Lehigh County, through a competitive solicitation process; and making a related repeal. (Senator BROWNE) - State Government, June 24, 2019



This bill authorizes the conveyance of state land that is situated partly in the City of Allentown and partly in the City of Bethlehem within the 16th Senatorial District and the 132nd and 133rd Legislative Districts.

THIRD CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE 1037

An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and for application; and, in exemptions, applicability and penalties, further providing for penalties. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, May 15, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

THIRD CONSIDERATION COMMERCE BILL

HOUSE 1410 2161

An Act amending the act of December 8, 2004 (P.L.1801, No.238), known as the Transit Revitalization Investment District Act, in general provisions, further providing for declaration of policy and for definitions; providing for military installation remediation; and establishing the Military Installation Remediation Fund. (Representatives STEPHENS, KENYATTA, ULLMAN and others) - Appropriations, June 18, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached 4

OVER


This bill provides for military installation remediation and establishes the Military Installation Remediation Fund.

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in terms and courses of study, providing for flexible instructional days. (Senators PHILLIPS-HILL, FOLMER, MARTIN and others) - Appropriations, June 20, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached



This bill provides for flexible instructional days.

THIRD CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

HOUSE 1005 2022

An Act amending the act of October 27, 2014 (P.L.2911, No.191), known as the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program (ABC-MAP) Act, further providing for purpose, for definitions, for powers and duties of board and for establishment of program and providing for requirements for first responder agencies and hospital emergency departments and for requirements for coroners and medical examiners. (Representatives COX, BERNSTINE, BROWN and others) – Appropriations, June 10, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached



This bill amends the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program Act to include the administration of naloxone in apatient's record on the ABC-MAP databasde.

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in judgments and other liens, further providing for exemption of particular property. (Representatives MOUL, PICKETT, RYAN and others) - Appropriations, June 03, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends Title 40 and Title 42 to provide consumer protections for annuity benefit plans.
