

This bill provides for the administration of certain Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program.



An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) – Environmental Resources & Energy, June 24, 2019 12

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILL

HOUSE A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, SIMS and others) - Judiciary, June 18, 2019 15

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE 785 856 An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) – Labor & Industry, June 20, 2019 13

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class. (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) - Local Government, October 21, 2019

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE An Act amending the act of June 30, 2011 (P.L.81, No.18), 1803 known as the Pennsylvania Web Accountability and Transparency 2567 (PennWATCH) Act, further providing for searchable budget database and for administration. (Representatives TOEPEL, OBERLANDER, DELOZIER and others) - State Government, October 21, 2019

This bill amends the PennWATCH Act to include information on each settlement paid to an individual, or to an employee of a Commonwealth agency, as a result of an action taken by an employee of a Commonwealth agency.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

HOUSE An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for 2058 definitions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for learners' permits; in rules of the road in general, repealing provisions relating to prohibiting text-based communications, prohibiting use of interactive wireless communications devices, imposing penalties and establishing the Distracted Driver Awareness Fund; and, in operation of vehicles miscellaneous provisions, further providing for the offense of homicide by vehicle and for the offense of aggravated assault by vehicle. (Representatives BROWN, READSHAW, STEPHENS and others) - Rules, September 19, 2019 5

This bill prohibits the use of hand-held interactive wireless communication devices while operating a motor vehicle.

SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILL

HOUSE 1673 2231 An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in volunteer firefighters, further providing for definitions, for statement of purpose, for funds and for audits. (Representatives FARRY, BARRAR, DiGIROLAMO and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 21, 2019 1

This bill authorizes Volunteer Fire Departments to use Volunteer Fire Relief Funds for Length of Service Award programs, which are mini-retirement programs for volunteer firefighters.

An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in incentives for municipal volunteers of fire companies and nonprofit emergency medical services agencies, further providing for definitions, for real property tax credit and for rejection and appeal. (Representatives GABLER, BARRAR, BERNSTINE and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 21, 2019 1

This bill authorizes school districts to provide a property tax credit of up to 100% for volunteer emergency responders.

HOUSE 1780 2370 An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in miscellaneous provisions, providing for exemption. (Representatives JAMES, BROOKS, GAYDOS and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 21, 2019 1 ____

This bill provides for the First Responder College Loan Forgiveness Program.

SENATE 146 1160 An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Commonwealth services, providing for online training for firefighters; and making a related repeal. (Senators BROOKS, SCARNATI, GORDNER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, September 25, 2019 2

This bill provides for Online Training for Firefighters.


This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

HOUSE 1283 1854 An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in judgments and other liens, further providing for exemption of particular property. (Representatives MOUL, PICKETT, RYAN and others) - Appropriations, September 17, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached 7

This bill amends Title 40 and Title 42 to provide consumer protections for annuity benefit plans.

This bill amends the Administrative Code to establish processes and timelines relating to applications for individual permits, general permits, general permits and general plan approvals required by an environmental law.




