SECOND CONSIDERATION APPROPRIATION BILL

SENATE 166 985 2019-2020. (Senator HUGHES) – Appropriations, November 21, 3

This bill is the capital budget for fiscal year 2019-2020.

SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL



This bill provides for the administration of certain Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILLS



An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, September 24, 2019 13

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

HOUSE 1633 2185 An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, further providing for employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster parents. (Representative BOBACK) - Rules, October 29, 2019 8

This bill amends the Child Protective Services Law to provide for additional background check requirements and to restrict provisional employment arrangements.

SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS

HOUSE 434 2743 An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of teachers, providing for a cultural competence continuing professional development course; and, in terms and courses of study, further providing for Holocaust, genocide and human rights violations instruction. (Representatives SOLOMON, GROVE, T. DAVIS and others) - Education, October 28, 2019 9

This bill amends the Public School Code to require the Department of Education to develop and implement a continuing professional education course on cultural awareness.

HOUSE 1800 2886 An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school district financial recovery, providing for duties of receivers in certain districts. (Representatives TURZAI, ROTHMAN, REESE and others) - Education, November 20, 2019 4

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for a program of tuition grants for certain school districts in receivership.

SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS

HOUSE 1881 2616 An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school security, further providing for school police officers powers and duties. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, STEPHENS, SNYDER and others) - Education, October 28, 2019 9


This bill amends the Public School Code to permit school police officers employed by a school district to exercise arrest powers if authorized by a court.

SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

HOUSE 247 999 An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, October 29, 2019 8

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL



This bill provides for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills from health care services from out-of-network providers.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

2918 An Act amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for investigation of circumstances of offense and providing for corrections officer statement, testimony and participation in hearing. (Representatives SNYDER, MULLERY, GOODMAN and others) – Judiciary, December 9, 2019 2

This bill amends Title 61 to require that a correction officer employed by the DOC provide a written statement to, or testify before, the PBPP regarding whether an inmate should be paroled.

HOUSE A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, SIMS and others) - Judiciary, October 22, 2019 11

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

HOUSE 256 2919 An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of assault by prisoner. (Representatives METZGAR, READSHAW, SNYDER and others) - Judiciary, December 9, 2019 2

This bill amends the Crimes Code to provide that a prisoner commits a felony of the second degree if he assaults a detention or correctional facility employee by means likely to produce bodily injury.

HOUSE 257 2920 An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of assault by prisoner. (Representatives METZGAR, READSHAW, SNYDER and others) - Judiciary, December 9, 2019 2

This bill amends the Crimes Code to provide that any inmate that commits an assault against a detention facility or correctional facility employee that results in serious bodily injury be sentenced to a mandatory minimum sentence of five years' incarceration.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS




An Act amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in miscellaneous provisions, further providing for contraband prohibited. (Representatives BOROWICZ, ROAE, CAUSER and others) - Judiciary, December 9, 2019 2

This bill amends Title 61 to allow the governing authority of a county to permit its county corrections officers to carry and store a handgun and ammunition in a vehicle at a county correctional institution.



An Act amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for parole power. (Representatives BERNSTINE, SAINATO, KAUFFMAN and others) - Judiciary, December 9, 2019 2

This bill amends Title 61 to preclude the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole from paroling an inmate at the expiration of his minimum sentence if the inmate was convicted of a violent offense or an obstruction of justice offense while incarcerated.



This bill amends the aggravated assault statute in order to add "a health care practitioner or technician".

SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE 785 856 An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) - Labor & Industry, October 28, 2019 9

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL



An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class. (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) – Local Government, October 21, 2019 12

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE 283 1736 An Act amending the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in procedure, further providing for written requests; and, in judicial review, further providing for fee limitations. (Representatives SIMMONS, NEILSON, IRVIN and others) - State Government, October 28, 2019 9

This bill provides for written requests and further provides for fee limitations.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS



An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for learners' permits; in rules of the road in general, repealing provisions relating to prohibiting text-based communications, prohibiting use of interactive wireless communications devices, imposing penalties and establishing the Distracted Driver Awareness Fund; and, in operation of vehicles miscellaneous provisions, further providing for the offense of homicide by vehicle and for the offense of aggravated assault by vehicle. (Representatives BROWN, READSHAW, STEPHENS and others) - Rules, December 10, 2019 1

This bill prohibits the use of hand-held interactive wireless communication devices while operating a motor vehicle.

HOUSE 1754 2345 An Act designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 4021 over the Honeoye Creek, Sharon Township, Potter County, as the Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge. (Representatives CAUSER, BURNS, CALTAGIRONE and others) - Transportation, October 30, 2019 7

This bill designates a bridge on a portion of S.R. 4021 in Potter County as the Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **TRANSPORTATION BILLS**

SENATE An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further 1384 providing for speed timing devices. (Senators SCAVELLO, MARTIN, BROWNE and others) - Transportation, December 9, 2019 2

This bill amends Title 75 to provide for speed timing devices.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **URBAN AFFAIRS BILL**

HOUSE An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the 22 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in home inspections, further 1012 providing for home inspection reports. (Representatives KORTZ, HELM, READSHAW and others) - Urban Affairs, September 23, 2019 15

This bill provides for home inspection reports.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS**


HOUSE An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act. in interpretation and 2568 definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in liability and compensation, further providing for compensation for post-traumatic stress injury. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BIZZARRO and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 23, 2019 10

This bill requires post-traumatic stress injuries to be compensable under workers compensation for first responders, including 911 center dispatchers and call takers, and corrections officers.

HOUSE An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management 2508 services, providing for emergency response payment. (Representatives DUSH, JOZWIAK, GREINER and others) - Veterans Affairs & **Emergency Preparedness, October 23, 2019** 10

This bill authorizes Volunteer Fire Departments to bill for real and reasonable costs.

SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS



This bill requires insurance carriers to reimburse ambulance companies directly that are not in the insurance carrier's network.

THIRD CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE 1037 1836 An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and for application; and, in exemptions, applicability and penalties, further providing for penalties. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, November 18, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached 6

This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

THIRD CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

HOUSE 1283 1854 An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in judgments and other liens, further providing for exemption of particular property. (Representatives MOUL, PICKETT, RYAN and others) - Appropriations, November 21, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached 3

This bill amends Title 40 and Title 42 to provide consumer protections for annuity benefit plans.

THIRD CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILL

HOUSE 196 168 A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, organizing the Judiciary into representative districts and further providing for residency requirements. (Representatives DIAMOND, BERNSTINE, CAUSER and others) – Appropriations, October 29, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached 8

This bill proposes integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, organizing the Judiciary into representative districts and further providing for residency requirements.

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in liability and compensation, further providing for the definitions of "injury," "personal injury" and "injury arising in the course of his employment," providing for diseases with long latency periods between occupational exposure and manifestation of the disease and further providing for liability. (Representatives COX, DUSH, FRITZ and others) - Appropriations, November 19, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached 5

This bill provides for the definitions of "injury," "personal injury" and "injury arising in the course of his employment," providing for diseases with long latency periods between occupational exposure and manifestation of the disease.

THIRD CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILLS

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, providing for environmental permits and plan approvals; making related repeals; and abrogating regulations. (Representatives PUSKARIC, TURZAI, KAUFER and others) - Appropriations, September 24, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached 14

This bill amends the Administrative Code to establish processes and timelines relating to applications for individual permits, general permits, general permits and general plan approvals required by an environmental law.



This bill designates a bridge on that portion of S.R. 2034 over PA Route 611 in Abington Township, Montgomery County, as the Captain Samuel Schultz Memorial Bridge.

FINAL PASSAGE **ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL**



This bill designates certain activity by the Delaware River Basin Commission as the exercise of the power of eminent domain that entitles the owners of the property in question to appropriate and just compensation.


