**SENATE 166** 

An Act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 985 2019-2020. (Senator HUGHES) - Appropriations, November 21, 2019

VOTE

This bill is the capital budget for fiscal year 2019-2020.

## SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILLS

**HOUSE 881** 

An Act amending the act of June 18, 1982 (P.L.549, No.159), entitled "An act providing for the administration of certain Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program. (Representatives FEE, RYAN, BERNSTINE and others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, November 20, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for the administration of certain Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILLS

**HOUSE 122**3

An Act providing for the creation of keystone opportunity dairy zones to facilitate the economic development of Pennsylvania's dairy industry; authorizing expenditures; providing tax exemptions, tax deductions, tax abatements and tax credits; creating additional obligations of the Commonwealth and local governmental units; and prescribing powers and duties of certain State and local departments, agencies and officials. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, December 16, 2019

 $\mathbf{VOTE}$ 

This bill creates Dairy KOZs.

**HOUSE 1224** 

An Act amending the act of April 28, 1937 (P.L.417, No.105), known as the Milk Marketing Law, in purpose, short title and definitions, further providing for definitions and construction; in general powers of the board, providing for coordination with Department of Revenue; and, in prices of milk, further providing for cooperatives. (Representatives LAWRENCE, BERNSTINE, CALTAGIRONE and others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, December 16, 2019



This bill provides specific authority to the PMMB regarding board establishes premiums.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILLS**

**HOUSE** 309

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, **September 24, 2019** 

OVER

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

**HOUSE** 

1633

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, further providing for employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster parents. (Representative BOBACK) - Rules, October 29, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Child Protective Services Law to provide for additional background check requirements and to restrict provisional employment arrangements.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION **EDUCATION BILLS**

HOUSE 434

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of 2743 teachers, providing for a cultural competence continuing professional development course; and, in terms and courses of study, further providing for Holocaust, genocide and human rights violations instruction. (Representatives SOLOMON, GROVE, T. DAVIS and others) - Education, October 28, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to require the Department of Education to develop and implement a continuing professional education course on cultural awareness.

**HOUSE** 1800

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school district financial 2886 recovery, providing for duties of receivers in certain districts. (Representatives TURZAI. ROTHMAN. REESE and others) - Education, November 20, 2019 5

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for a program of tuition grants for certain school districts in receivership.

HOUSE

1881

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school security, further 2616 providing for school police officers powers and duties. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, STEPHENS, SNYDER and others) - Education, October 28, 2019 10

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to permit school police officers employed by a school district to exercise arrest powers if authorized by a court.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION** ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

HOUSE **247** 

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, October 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

**SENATE 432** 

An Act amending the act of October 27, 2014 (P.L.2911, No.191), known as the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions Program (ABC-MAP) Act, further providing for access to prescription information. (Senators PHILLIPS-HILL, J. WARD, BROWNE and others) - Health, December 16, 2019

C VOTE

This bill amends the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All Prescriptions program to allow Medicaid Managed Care Organizations to query the system.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

HOUSE 1862

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health care accountability and protection, providing for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills for health care services from out-of-network providers. (Representatives PICKETT, DeLUCA, BROWN and others) – Insurance, October 30, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills from health care services from out-of-network providers.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

**HOUSE** 

**44** 2919

An Act amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for investigation of circumstances of offense and providing for corrections officer statement, testimony and participation in hearing. (Representatives SNYDER, MULLERY, GOODMAN and others) – Judiciary, December 9, 2019

**OVER** 

This bill amends Title 61 to require that a correction officer employed by the DOC provide a written statement to, or testify before, the PBPP regarding whether an inmate should be paroled.

HOUSE

1630

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, SIMS and others) - Judiciary, October 22, 2019

OVER

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

**HOUSE 256** 

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of assault by prisoner. (Representatives METZGAR, READSHAW, SNYDER and others) - Judiciary, December

OVER

This bill amends the Crimes Code to provide that a prisoner commits a felony of the second degree if he assaults a detention or correctional facility employee by means likely to produce bodily injury.

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the 257 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of assault by prisoner. (Representatives METZGAR, READSHAW, SNYDER and others) - Judiciary, December 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Crimes Code to provide that any inmate that commits an assault against a detention facility or correctional facility employee that results in serious bodily injury be sentenced to a mandatory minimum sentence of five years' incarceration.

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in miscellaneous provisions, further providing for contraband prohibited. (Representatives BOROWICZ, ROAE, CAUSER and others) - Judiciary, December 9, 2019

 $\mathbf{VOTE}$ 

This bill amends Title 61 to allow the governing authority of a county to permit its county corrections officers to carry and store a handgun and ammunition in a vehicle at a county correctional institution.

**HOUSE** 

**1855** 

An Act amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Pennsylvania Board of 2921 Probation and Parole, further providing for parole power. (Representatives BERNSTINE, SAINATO, KAUFFMAN others) - Judiciary, December 9, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 61 to preclude the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole from paroling an inmate at the expiration of his minimum sentence if the inmate was convicted of a violent offense or an obstruction of justice offense while incarcerated.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

**HOUSE** 1879

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing 2600 for the offense of aggravated assault. (Representatives GILLESPIE, ULLMAN, MILLARD and others) - Judiciary, November 21,

 $\mathbf{VOTE}$ 

This bill amends the aggravated assault statute in order to add "a health care practitioner or technician".

**SENATE 500** 

An Act amending the act of November 22, 1978 (P.L.1166, No.274), referred to as the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and 1422 Delinquency Law, providing for County Adult Probation and Parole Advisory Committee, for county probation officers' firearm education and training, for justice reinvestment grants, phase 2, for continuing county probation and parole grants and for county intermediate punishment funding. (Senators BAKER, BARTOLOTTA, KILLION and others) - Judiciary, December 16, 2019

This bill amends PA Commission on Crime & Delinquency Law to establish an advisory committee on adult county probation within PCCD, Establish Justice Reinvestment grants, & reinvest costs savings into county probation & parole.

**SENATE 501** 

An Act amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in judicial boards and commissions, providing for commission, for composition of commission and for powers and duties of commission, for adoption of guidelines for sentencing, for adoption of guidelines for county intermediate punishment, for adoption of guidelines for State intermediate punishment and for adoption of risk assessment instrument; in judgments and other liens, further providing for personal earnings exempt from process; in sentencing, further providing for sentences for offenses against infant persons, for sentencing generally, for collection of restitution, reparation, fees, costs, fines and penalties, for payments of court costs, restitution and fines, for order of probation, for sentence of partial confinement, for sentence of total confinement, for sentence of county intermediate punishment, for information required upon commitment and subsequent disposition, for modification or revocation of order of probation, for court-imposed sanctions for offenders violating probation, for modification or revocation of county intermediate punishment sentence and for revocation of State intermediate punishment sentence; in county intermediate punishment, further providing for county intermediate punishment programs and for continued eligibility; in motivational boot camp, further providing for definitions, for selection of inmate participants and for motivational boot camp program; in State intermediate punishment, further providing for scope of chapter, for definitions, for referral to State intermediate punishment program, for drug offender treatment program and for reports; in recidivism risk reduction incentive, further providing for definitions, for sentencing,

This bill amends Title 42 & 61 to incorporate county intermediate punishment program into county probation, to rename State Intermediate Punishment Program the State Drug Treatment Program, to provide for presumptive parole for certain short-term minimum sentences in state correctional institutions, to amend duties of PA Sentencing Commission, to add other correction system & sentencing changes commonly known as "Justice Reinvestment Initiative 2."

SENATE **502** 1424

An Act amending the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, in preliminary provisions. further providing for definitions; in crime victims, further providing for rights, for responsibilities of victims of crime under basic bill of rights, for responsibilities of State and local law enforcement agencies and for responsibilities of prosecutor's office; in administration, further providing for office, for powers and duties of victim advocate and for powers and duties of Office of Victims' Services; in parole advocacy, further providing for preparole notification to victim and for petitions to deny parole upon expiration of minimum sentence; in compensation, further providing for persons eligible for compensation, for filing of claims for compensation, for minimum allowable claim, for determination of claims, for emergency awards, for awards and for confidentiality of records; in services, further providing for eligibility of victims; in financial matters, further providing for costs and for costs for offender supervision programs; and, in enforcement, further providing for subrogation. (Senators BARTOLOTTA, HUGHES, HAYWOOD and others) - Judiciary, December 16, 2019

This bill amends the Crime Victims Act to make omnibus changes to victims' rights and compensation.

OVER

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

**HOUSE** 1074 1614

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in **counties of the second class.** (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) - Local Government, October 21, 2019 13

OVER

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION** STATE GOVERNMENT BILL

**HOUSE 283** 

An Act amending the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law, in preliminary provisions, further 1736 providing for definitions; in procedure, further providing for written requests; and, in judicial review, further providing for fee limitations. (Representatives SIMMONS, NEILSON, IRVIN and others) - State Government, October 28, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for written requests and further provides for fee limitations.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

**HOUSE 37** 

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for learners' permits; in rules of the road in general, repealing provisions relating to prohibiting text-based communications, prohibiting use of interactive wireless communications devices, imposing penalties and

This bill designates a bridge on a portion of S.R. 4021 in Potter County as the Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge.

HOUSE 1946 2710

An Act designating a bridge, identified by Bridge Key 46789, on that portion of State Route 3012 over Back Creek on the border of Hamilton Township and St. Thomas Township, Franklin County, as the Sergeant Melvin G. Ehrhart Memorial Bridge. (Representatives HERSHEY, BERNSTINE, BURNS and others) - Transportation, December 16, 2019



This bill designates a bridge on a portion of S.R. 3012 in Franklin County as the Sergeant Melvin G. Ehrhart Memorial Bridge.

SENATE 607

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further providing for speed timing devices. (Senators SCAVELLO, MARTIN, BROWNE and others) - Transportation, December 9, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 75 to provide for speed timing devices.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION URBAN AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE 122 1012

An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in home inspections, further providing for home inspection reports. (Representatives KORTZ, HELM, READSHAW and others) - Urban Affairs, December 16, 2019

**OVER** 

This bill provides for home inspection reports.

## SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS

HOUSE 432 2568

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in interpretation and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in liability and compensation, further providing for compensation for post-traumatic stress injury. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BIZZARRO and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 23, 2019

**OVER** 

This bill requires post-traumatic stress injuries to be compensable under workers compensation for first responders, including 911 center dispatchers and call takers, and corrections officers.

HOUSE

2508

An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for emergency response payment. (Representatives DUSH, JOZWIAK, GREINER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 23, 2019

OVER

This bill authorizes Volunteer Fire Departments to bill for real and reasonable costs.

HOUSE 1347

19 k

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in casualty insurance, further providing for billing. (Representatives MASSER, WHEELAND, IRVIN and others) – Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 23, 2019

OVER

This bill requires insurance carriers to reimburse ambulance companies directly that are not in the insurance carrier's network.

### THIRD CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE 1037

An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and for application; and, in exemptions, applicability and penalties, further providing for penalties. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, November 18, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

**OVER** 

This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

**OVER** 

This bill provides for the definitions of "injury," "personal injury" and "injury arising in the course of his employment," providing for diseases with long latency periods between occupational exposure and manifestation of the disease.

HOUSE 1106 1599

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, providing for environmental permits and plan approvals; making related repeals; and abrogating regulations. OVER

This bill amends the Administrative Code to establish processes and timelines relating to applications for individual permits, general permits, general permits and general plan approvals required by an environmental law.

OVER

This bill amends the Constitution to establish limitations on the spending of Commonwealth funds.
