#### SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILLS

HOUSE 881

An Act amending the act of June 18, 1982 (P.L.549, No.159), entitled "An act providing for the administration of certain 1434 Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program. (Representatives FEE, RYAN, BERNSTINE others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, November 20, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for the administration of certain Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program.

**HOUSE** 

An Act providing for limited civil liability for agritourism activity providers, for notice of limited civil liability and for acknowledgment 2013 of limited civil liability. (Representatives GLEIM, GREINER, CAUSER and others) - Rules, December 17, 2019

VOTE



This bill provides for limited civil liability for agritourism activity providers, for notice of limited civil liability and for acknowledgment of limited civil liability.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION **CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILLS**

HOUSE 309

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and 289 known as the Human Scribes Code, in Translation of Market Stars Program duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth, **September 24, 2019** 

OVER

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

HOUSE

**1633** 

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, 2185 further providing for employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster parents. (Representative BOBACK) - Rules, October 29, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Child Protective Services Law to provide for additional background check requirements and to restrict provisional employment arrangements.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS**

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of 2743 teachers, providing for a cultural competence continuing professional development course; and, in terms and courses of study, further providing for Holocaust, genocide and human rights violations instruction. (Representatives SOLOMON, GROVE, T. DAVIS and others) - Education, October 28, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to require the Department of Education to develop and implement a continuing professional education course on cultural awareness.

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school district financial 2886 recovery, providing for duties of receivers in certain districts. (Representatives TURZAI, ROTHMAN, REESE and others) - Education, November 20, 2019 6

VOTE

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for a program of tuition grants for certain school districts in receivership.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS

HOUSE 1881

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school security, further providing for school police officers powers and duties. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, STEPHENS, SNYDER and others) - Education, October 28, 2019

**OVER** 

This bill amends the Public School Code to permit school police officers employed by a school district to exercise arrest powers if authorized by a court.

## SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) – Environmental Resources & Energy, October 29, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income relating to employee stock ownership plans. (Representatives METCALFE, STAATS, RYAN and others) - Finance, December 17, 2019

VOTE

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to define income relating to distributions from an Employee Stock Ownership Plan.

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of May 30, 1984 (P.L.345, No.69), known as the First Class City Business Tax Reform Act, further providing for definitions. (Representatives WHITE, HILL-EVANS, PYLE and others) - Finance, December 17, 2019

VOTE

(C)

This bill amends the First Class City Business Tax Reform Act to provide a net operating loss deduction update.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION **INSURANCE BILL**

HOUSE 1862

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health 2795 care accountability and protection, providing for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills for health care services from out-of-network providers. (Representatives PICKETT, DeLUCA, BROWN and others) - Insurance, October 30, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills from health care services from out-of-network providers.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS**

**HOUSE** 

44

An Act amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Pennsylvania Board of 2918 Probation and Parole, further providing for investigation of circumstances of offense and providing for corrections officer statement, testimony and participation in hearing. (Representatives SNYDER, MULLERY, GOODMAN and others) - Judiciary, December 9, 2019

VOTE

This bill amends Title 61 to require that a correction officer employed by the DOC provide a written statement to, or testify before, the PBPP regarding whether an inmate should be paroled.

**HOUSE** 

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and 1630 adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. SCHEMEL, McCLINTON. (Representatives SIMS and others) - Judiciary, October 22, 2019 13

OVER

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

**HOUSE** 

256

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of assault by prisoner. (Representatives METZGAR, READSHAW, SNYDER and others) - Judiciary, December 2019

This bill amends the Crimes Code to provide that a prisoner commits a felony of the second degree if he assaults a detention or correctional facility employee by means likely to produce bodily injury.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

**HOUSE 257** 

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing 2920 for the offense of assault by prisoner. (Representatives METZGAR, READSHAW, SNYDER and others) - Judiciary, December



This bill amends the Crimes Code to provide that any inmate that commits an assault against a detention facility or correctional facility employee that results in serious bodily injury be sentenced to a mandatory minimum sentence of five years' incarceration.

**HOUSE** 

440

An Act amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in criminal history record information, further providing for expungement, for petition for limited access, for clean slate limited access and for effects of expunged records and records subject to limited access; and, in administration of justice, further providing for attachment and summary punishment for contempts. (Representatives NESBIT, McCLINTON, **BRIGGS** and others) - Judiciary, December 17, 2019 1 VOTE



This bill amends Section 9122 to mandate expungement of a person's criminal history record information where a person has been pardoned or acquitted of all charges.

HOUSE

**1477** 

Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 63 (Professions and Occupations (State Licensed)) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in criminal history record information, further providing for use of records by licensing agencies; providing for preliminary provisions and for Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs; consolidating the provisions of Act 48 of 1993; and making a related repeal. (Representatives DELOZIER, HARRIS, BOBACK and others) - Judiciary, December 17, 2019



This bill amends Section 9124 of the Criminal History Record Information Act to delineate when a board, commission or department of the Commonwealth may deny the issuance or renewal of an occupational license as a result of a criminal conviction.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 1555 3006

Amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated States, in sentencing, further providing for order of probation and for modification or revocation of order of probation; in other criminal provisions, further providing for definitions and for supervisory relationship to offenders; and, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for supervisory relationship to offenders. (Representatives DELOZIER, HARRIS, JONES and others) – Judiciary, December 17, 2019

**OVER** 

This bill amends Title 42 to limit probationary terms, set forth a procedure for the courts to apply when addressing probation violations, restricting the sanctions for probation violators, providing various means by which a person on probation can reduce the length of that probation, and applying these changes retroactively.

HOUSE 1855 2921

An Act amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for parole power. (Representatives BERNSTINE, SAINATO, KAUFFMAN and others) - Judiciary, December 9, 2019

VOITE

This bill amends Title 61 to preclude the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole from paroling an inmate at the expiration of his minimum sentence if the inmate was convicted of a violent offense or an obstruction of justice offense while incarcerated.

HOUSE 2040 286

An Act providing for the PA Second Chance Jobs website and for powers and duties of the Department of Labor and Industry. (Representatives HARRIS, LEWIS, DELLOSO and others) – Judiciary, December 17, 2019

OVER

This bill creates the PA Second Chance Jobs website to provide a free and voluntary website where employers may advertise employment opportunities for former offenders.

**SENATE 502** 

1424

An Act amending the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in crime victims, further providing for rights, for responsibilities of victims of crime under basic bill of rights, for responsibilities of State and local law enforcement agencies and for responsibilities of prosecutor's office; in administration, further providing for office, for powers and duties of victim advocate and for powers and duties of Office of Victims' Services; in parole advocacy, further providing for preparole notification to victim and for petitions to deny parole upon expiration of minimum sentence; in compensation, further providing for persons eligible for compensation, for filing of claims for compensation, for minimum allowable claim, for determination of claims, for emergency awards, for awards and for confidentiality

OVER

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

HOUSE 1074 1614

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class. (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) – Local Government, October 21, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILLS

**HOUSE 283** 

An Act amending the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in procedure, further providing for written requests; and, in judicial review, further providing for fee limitations. (Representatives SIMMONS, NEILSON, IRVIN and others) - State Government, October 28, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for written requests and further provides for fee limitations.

**SENATE 750** 

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, in powers and duties 1188 of the Department of General Services and its departmental administrative and advisory boards and commissions, further providing for grounds, buildings and monuments in general and providing for transfer the authority of Lieutenant Governor's Mansion; and making a related repeal. (Senators SCARNATI, CORMAN, YAW and others) - State Government, December 17,

VOTE

This bill provides for grounds, buildings and monuments in general and providing for the transfer of the authority of the Lieutenant Governor's Mansion.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania 2058 Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for learners' permits; in rules of the road in general, repealing provisions relating to prohibiting text-based communications, prohibiting use of interactive wireless communications devices, imposing penalties and establishing the Distracted Driver Awareness Fund; and, in operation of vehicles miscellaneous provisions, further providing for the offense of homicide by vehicle and for the offense of aggravated assault by vehicle. (Representatives BROWN, READSHAW, STEPHENS and others) - Rules, December 10, 2019

OVER

This bill prohibits the use of hand-held interactive wireless communication devices while operating a motor vehicle.


OVER

This bill designates a bridge on a portion of S.R. 4021 in Potter County as the Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

**HOUSE** 1849

An Act designating a portion of Pennsylvania Route 39 in Dauphin County, from Dover Road to Forest Hills Drive, as the 2556 Officer Mark Gaspich Memorial Highway. (Representatives LEWIS, KORTZ, HILL-EVANS and others) - Transportation, December 17,



This bill designates a portion of S.R. 39, from Dover Road to Forest Hills Drive, in Dauphin County as the Officer Mark Gaspich Memorial Highway.

**HOUSE** 

An Act designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 11414, on U.S. Route 219 in Brady Township, Clearfield County, as the Lance 2588 Corporal Robert Clyde Gontero Memorial Bridge. (Representatives GABLER, DUSH, SANKEY and others) - Transportation, December 17, 2019



This bill designates a bridge on U.S. Route 219 in Brady Township in Clearfield County as the Lance Corporal Robert Clyde Gontero Memorial Bridge.

**SENATE** 

607

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further providing for speed timing devices. (Senators SCAVELLO, MARTIN, BROWNE and others) - Transportation, December 9, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 75 to provide for speed timing devices.

#### **SECOND CONSIDERATION URBAN AFFAIRS BILL**

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in home inspections, further providing for home inspection reports. (Representatives KORTZ, HELM, READSHAW and others) - Urban Affairs, December 16, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for home inspection reports.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS

HOUSE **432** 

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in interpretation and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in liability and compensation, further providing for compensation for post-traumatic stress injury. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BIZZARRO and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 23, 2010

**OVER** 

This bill requires post-traumatic stress injuries to be compensable under workers compensation for first responders, including 911 center dispatchers and call takers, and corrections officers.

**HOUSE 759** 

**2508** 

An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for emergency response payment. (Representatives DUSH, JOZWIAK, GREINER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 23, 2019

**OVER** 

This bill authorizes Volunteer Fire Departments to bill for real and reasonable costs.

HOUSE

1347

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in casualty insurance, further providing for billing. (Representatives MASSER, WHEELAND, IRVIN and others) – Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 23, 2019

OVER

This bill requires insurance carriers to reimburse ambulance companies directly that are not in the insurance carrier's network.


