SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE 881

An Act amending the act of June 18, 1982 (P.L.549, No.159), entitled "An act providing for the administration of certain 1434 Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program. (Representatives FEE, RYAN, BERNSTINE others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, November 20, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for the administration of certain Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILLS**

HOUSE 309

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Children & Youth,

VOTE

This bill requires child care facilities to publicly display their Keystone STARS rating.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILLS

HOUSE 1633

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, further providing for employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster parents. (Representative BOBACK) - Rules, October 29, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Child Protective Services Law to provide for additional background check requirements and to restrict provisional employment arrangements.

SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS

HOUSE 131

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of teachers, providing for a cultural competence continuing professional development course; and, in terms and courses of study, further providing for Holocaust, genocide and human rights violations instruction. (Representatives SOLOMON, GROVE, T.

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to require the Department of Education to develop and implement a continuing professional education course on cultural awareness.

DAVIS and others) - Education, October 28, 2019

HOUSE 1800

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school district financial recovery, providing for duties of receivers in certain districts. (Representatives TURZAI, ROTHMAN, REESE and others) – Education, November 20, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for a program of tuition grants for certain school districts in receivership.

HOUSE 1881

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school security, further providing for school police officers powers and duties. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, STEPHENS, SNYDER and others) - Education, October 28, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to permit school police officers employed by a school district to exercise arrest powers if authorized by a court.

SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, October 29, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

SECOND CONSIDERATION GAME AND FISHERIES BILL

HOUSE 1003 1155

An Act amending Title 30 (Fish) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in dams, bar racks and migration devices, further providing for marking of dams. (Representatives GILLESPIE, PICKETT, JAMES and others) - Rules, January 14, 2020

VOTE

This bill provides for marking of dams.

HOUSE 1187

An Act amending Title 30 (Fish) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in special licenses and permits, further providing for Lake Erie fishing permits. (Representatives WENTLING, HARKINS, KORTZ and others) - Game & Fisheries, January 14, 2020 1

VOTE

This bill amends Title 30 to expand the allowable use of funds from the sale of Lake Erie Fishing Permits.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

SENATE 906

An Act amending the act of October 20, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.96, No.6), known as the Mental Health and Intellectual Disability Act of 1966, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; and, in responsibilities of the State, providing for State center closure moratorium. (Senators YUDICHAK, BAKER, BROOKS and others) – Health. January 14, 2020

VOLE

This bill amends the Mental Health and Intellectual Disability Act to institute a moratorium on the closure of the state centers.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS

HOUSE 564

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health care accountability and protection, further providing for prompt payment of claims. (Representatives SAYLOR, RYAN, BARRAR and others) - Rules, January 14, 2020

VOTE

This bill provides for prompt payment of claims.

HOUSE 1862 2795

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health care accountability and protection, providing for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills for health care services from out-of-network providers. (Representatives PICKETT, DeLUCA, BROWN and others) – Insurance, October 30, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills from health care services from out-of-network providers.

HOUSE 2106 2991

An Act amending the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.738, No.233), known as The Pennsylvania Fair Plan Act, repealing provisions relating to Pennsylvania Civil Disorder Authority and to basic property insurance assessment; and, in miscellaneous, further providing for effective date. (Representatives PUSKARIC, JAMES, BERNSTINE and others) – Insurance, January 14, 2020

VOTE

This bill repeals provisions relating to Pennsylvania Civil Disorder Authority and to basic property insurance assessment.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 111 1630

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, SIMS and others) - Judiciary, January 13, 2020

OVER

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 1555 3006

Amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated States, in sentencing, further providing for order of probation and for modification or revocation of order of probation; in other criminal provisions, further providing for definitions and for supervisory relationship to offenders; and, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for supervisory relationship to offenders. (Representatives DELOZIER, HARRIS, JONES and others) – Judiciary, December 17, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 42 to limit probationary terms, set forth a procedure for the courts to apply when addressing probation violations, restricting the sanctions for probation violators, providing various means by which a person on probation can reduce the length of that probation, and applying these changes retroactively.

HOUSE 1851

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for offenses committed with firearms and providing for sentences for persons not to possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms.. (Representatives STEPHENS, QUINN, BERNSTINE and others) – Judiciary, December 18, 2019

OVER

This bill amends two provisions in Title 42 to require mandatory minimum sentences for felons convicted of illegally possessing a firearm and to expand the definition of the term "crime of violence" to include the offense of a felon in possession of a firearm.

HOUSE 2040 2867

An Act providing for the PA Second Chance Jobs website and for powers and duties of the Department of Labor and Industry. (Representatives HARRIS, LEWIS, DELLOSO and others) – Judiciary, December 17, 2019

OVER

This bill creates the PA Second Chance Jobs website to provide a free and voluntary website where employers may advertise employment opportunities for former offenders.

SENATE 502

1424

An Act amending the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in crime victims, further providing for rights, for responsibilities of victims of crime under basic bill of rights, for responsibilities of State and local law enforcement agencies and for responsibilities of prosecutor's office; in administration, further providing for office, for powers and duties of victim advocate and for powers and duties of Office of Victims' Services; in parole advocacy, further providing for preparole notification to victim and for petitions to deny parole upon expiration of minimum sentence; in compensation, further providing for persons eligible for compensation, for filing of claims for compensation, for minimum allowable claim, for determination of

An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) – Labor & Industry, October 28, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Public Employe Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILLS

HOUSE 908

An Act amending the act of January 19, 1968 (1967 P.L.992, No.442), entitled "An act authorizing the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the local government units thereof to preserve, acquire or hold land for open space uses,"further providing for local taxing options. (Representatives RADER, FREEMAN, BROWN and others) - Local Government, January 14, 2020

C)

This bill clarifies how funds dedicated for maintenance can be used for open space land.

HOUSE 1074 1614

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class. (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) - Local Government, January 7, 2020 3

OVER

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE 283

An Act amending the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law, in preliminary provisions, further 1736 providing for definitions; in procedure, further providing for written requests; and, in judicial review, further providing for fee limitations. (Representatives SIMMONS, NEILSON, IRVIN and others) - State Government, October 28, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for written requests and further provides for fee limitations.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for learners' permits; in rules of the road in general, repealing provisions relating to prohibiting text-based communications, prohibiting use of interactive wireless communications devices, imposing penalties and establishing the Distracted Driver Awareness Fund; and, in operation of vehicles miscellaneous provisions, further providing for the offense of homicide by vehicle and for the offense of aggravated assault by vehicle. (Representatives BROWN, READSHAW, STEPHENS and others) - Rules, December 10, 2019

VOTE

This bill prohibits the use of hand-held interactive wireless communication devices while operating a motor vehicle.

HOUSE

1754

An Act designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 4021 over the Honeoye Creek, Sharon Township, Potter County, as the 2345 Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge. (Representatives CAUSER, BURNS, CALTAGIRONE and others) - Transportation, October 30, 2019

OVER

This bill designates a bridge on a portion of S.R. 4021 in Potter County as the Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge.

SENATE 607

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further providing for speed timing devices. (Senators SCAVELLO, MARTIN, BROWNE and others) - Transportation, December 9, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 75 to provide for speed timing devices.

SECOND CONSIDERATION URBAN AFFAIRS BILLS

HOUSE 122 1012

An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in home inspections, further providing for home inspection reports. (Representatives KORTZ, HELM, READSHAW and others) - Urban Affairs, December 16, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for home inspection reports.

HOUSE 1060

1860 2940

An Act amending the act of May 24, 1945 (P.L.991, No.385), known as the Urban Redevelopment Law, further providing for definitions, for formation of authorities, for dissolution of city authorities and for eminent domain; and making editorial changes. (Representatives LONGIETTI, NESBIT, HILL-EVANS and others) - Urban Affairs, January 14, 2020

C)

This bill amends the Urban Redevelopment Authority Act to allow Boroughs of all sizes to create Redevelopment Authorities.

SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS

HOUSE 408

An Act amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Department of Military Affairs, providing for burial benefits. (Representatives STAATS, McNEILL, STURLA and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020

C VOTE

This bill provides for funeral directors/entities to notify county Veteran Affairs Offices upon the death of a veteran.

HOUSE

2568

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in interpretation and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in liability and compensation, further providing for compensation for post-traumatic stress injury. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BIZZARRO and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020

OVER

This bill requires post-traumatic stress injuries to be compensable under workers compensation for first responders, including 911 center dispatchers and call takers, and corrections officers.

SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS

HOUSE 759

An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for emergency response payment. (Representatives DUSH, JOZWIAK, GREINER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020

OVER

This bill authorizes Volunteer Fire Departments to bill for real and reasonable costs.

HOUSE 1347 2149

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in casualty insurance, further providing for billing. (Representatives MASSER, WHEELAND, IRVIN and others) – Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020

OVER

This bill requires insurance carriers to reimburse ambulance companies directly that are not in the insurance carrier's network.

THIRD CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILLS

HOUSE 1037 183

An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and for application; and, in exemptions, applicability and penalties, further providing for penalties. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) – Appropriations, November 18, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

HOUSE

1348 3056

An Act providing for limited civil liability for agritourism activity providers, for notice of limited civil liability and for acknowledgment of limited civil liability. (Representatives GLEIM, GREINER, CAUSER and others) – Appropriations, December 18, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill creates limited liability protection for agritourism activity providers.

THIRD CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

HOUSE 1283

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in judgments and other liens, further providing for exemption of particular property. (Representatives MOUL, PICKETT, RYAN and others) - Appropriations, November 21, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends Title 40 and Title 42 to provide consumer protections for annuity benefit plans.

THIRD CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILL

HOUSE 1850 2531

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for offenses committed with firearms and for sentences for certain drug offenses committed with firearms. (Representatives STEPHENS, QUINN, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, January 13, 2020 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends two provisions in the Judicial Code to restore a 5-year mandatory minimum sentence for violent crimes committed with firearms and drug deliveries committed with firearms.

THIRD CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE 1234 2813

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in liability and compensation, further providing for the definitions of "injury," "personal injury" and "injury arising in the course of his employment," providing for diseases with long latency periods between occupational exposure and manifestation of the disease and further providing for liability. (Representatives COX, DUSH, FRITZ and others) - Appropriations, November 19, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill provides for the definitions of "injury," "personal injury" and "injury arising in the course of his employment," providing for diseases with long latency periods between occupational exposure and manifestation of the disease.

HOUSE 1106 1599

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, providing for environmental permits and plan approvals; making related repeals; and abrogating regulations. OVER

This bill amends the Administrative Code to establish processes and timelines relating to applications for individual permits, general permits, general permits and general plan approvals required by an environmental law.

HOUSE 1316 1535

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in taxation and finance, providing for spending limitations on the Commonwealth. (Representatives WARNER, HERSHEY, AND BURNS) - Appropriations, December 16, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends the Constitution to establish limitations on the spending of Commonwealth funds.

OVER
