SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE **881**

An Act amending the act of June 18, 1982 (P.L.549, No.159), entitled "An act providing for the administration of certain Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program. (Representatives FEE, RYAN, BERNSTINE and others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, November 20, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for the administration of certain Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILL

HOUSE 1633

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, further providing for employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster parents. (Representative BOBACK) - Rules, January 21, 2020

OVER

This bill amends the Child Protective Services Law to provide for additional background check requirements and to restrict provisional employment arrangements.

SECOND CONSIDERATION COMMERCE BILL

HOUSE 1769

An Act amending the act of October 16, 1996 (P.L.712, No.127), known as the Charitable Gift Annuity Exemption Act, further providing for definitions. (Representatives MACKENZIE, BERNSTINE, CALTAGIRONE and others) - Commerce, February 4, 2020



This bill amends the Charitable Gift Annuity Exemption Act to provide for the definition of "de-risking annuity contracts".

SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of teachers, providing for a cultural competence continuing professional development course; and, in terms and courses of study, further providing for Holocaust, genocide and human rights violations instruction. (Representatives SOLOMON, GROVE, T.

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to require the Department of Education to develop and implement a continuing professional education course on cultural awareness.

DAVIS and others) - Education, January 15, 2020

HOUSE 1800

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school district financial recovery, providing for duties of receivers in certain districts. (Representatives TURZAI, ROTHMAN, REESE and others) - Education, November 20, 2019

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for a program of tuition grants for certain school districts in receivership.

HOUSE 1881

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school security, further providing for school police officers powers and duties. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, STEPHENS, SNYDER and others) - Education, January 15, 2020 5

OVER

This bill amends the Public School Code to permit school police officers employed by a school district to exercise arrest powers if authorized by a court.

SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, January 21, 2020

OVER

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

HOUSE 1912 2660

An Act amending the act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), known as the Vital Statistics Law of 1953, in records, further providing for records and fees for copies. (Representatives ZIMMERMAN, READSHAW, JAMES and others) - Health, February 3, 2020

OVER

This bill amends the Vital Statistics Law to eliminate the fee for a death certificate for coroners in the performance of their official duties for unclaimed bodies.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HUMAN SERVICES BILL

HOUSE 1895

An Act amending the act of July 9, 1976 (P.L.817, No.143), known as the Mental Health Procedures Act, in general provisions, further providing for rights and remedies of persons in treatment. (Representatives ROWE, BERNSTINE, CALTAGIRONE and others) – Human Services, February 4, 2020

C

This bill provides for rights of patients receiving mental health care to be free from abuse, neglect and exploitation.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS

HOUSE 564 2284

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health care accountability and protection, further providing for prompt payment of claims. (Representatives SAYLOR, RYAN, BARRAR and others) - Rules, January 14, 2020 6

OVER

This bill provides for prompt payment of claims.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS

HOUSE 1862 2795

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health care accountability and protection, providing for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills for health care services from out-of-network providers. (Representatives PICKETT, DeLUCA, BROWN and others) - Insurance, January 22, 2020

OVER

This bill provides for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills from health care services from out-of-network providers.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 111 1630

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, ISAACSON and others) - Judiciary, January 13, 2020

OVER

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

HOUSE

437 3194

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child custody, further providing for award of custody. (Representatives KAIL, KAUFFMAN, KORTZ and others) – Judiciary, February 4, 2020 1

VOTE

This bill amends Title 23 as it relates to contempt powers of the court in custody cases.

HOUSE **1555**

006

Amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated States, in sentencing, further providing for order of probation and for modification or revocation of order of probation; in other criminal provisions, further providing for definitions and for supervisory relationship to offenders; and, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for supervisory relationship to offenders. (Representatives DELOZIER, HARRIS, JONES and others) – Judiciary, December 17, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 42 to limit probationary terms, set forth a procedure for the courts to apply when addressing probation violations, restricting the sanctions for probation violators, providing various means by which a person on probation can reduce the length of that probation, and applying these changes retroactively.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 1851

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for offenses committed with firearms and providing for sentences for persons not to possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms.. (Representatives STEPHENS, QUINN, BERNSTINE and others) – Judiciary, December 18, 2019

OVER

This bill amends two provisions in Title 42 to require mandatory minimum sentences for felons convicted of illegally possessing a firearm and to expand the definition of the term "crime of violence" to include the offense of a felon in possession of a firearm.

HOUSE

1984 2789

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in proceedings prior to petition to adopt, further providing for petition for involuntary termination and providing for special provisions when child conceived as a result of rape or incest. (Representatives BENNINGHOFF, BERNSTINE, BOBACK and others) – Judiciary, February 4, 2020 1

VOTE

This bill amends the Adoption act so that victims of rape can terminate parental rights of the rapist without having to re-marry.

HOUSE **2040** 2867

An Act providing for the PA Second Chance Jobs website and for powers and duties of the Department of Labor and Industry. (Representatives HARRIS, LEWIS, DELLOSO and others) – Judiciary, December 17, 2019

OVER

This bill creates the PA Second Chance Jobs website to provide a free and voluntary website where employers may advertise employment opportunities for former offenders.

SENATE

An Act amending the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in crime victims, further providing for rights, for responsibilities of victims of crime under basic bill of rights, for responsibilities of State and local law enforcement agencies and for responsibilities of prosecutor's office; in administration, further providing for office, for powers and duties of victim advocate and for powers and duties of Office of Victims' Services; in parole advocacy, further providing for preparole notification to victim and for petitions to deny parole upon expiration of minimum sentence; in compensation, further providing for persons eligible for compensation, for filing of claims for compensation, for minimum allowable claim, for determination of claims, for emergency awards, for awards and for confidentiality

(Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) - Labor & Industry, January 15, 2020

OVER

This bill amends the Public Employee Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILLS

HOUSE **188**

An Act providing for property owner's bill of rights statement. (Representatives QUINN, COX, SIMMONS and others) – Local Government, February 4, 2020

VOTE

This bill provides for property owner's bill of rights statement.

HOUSE

1074 1614

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class. (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) – Local Government, January 7, 2020 8

OVER

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE 2039

An Act amending the act of December 20, 2015 (P.L.497, No.90), known as the Taxpayer-Funded Advertising Transparency Act, 2866 further providing for definitions and for advertising notification; and making a related repeal. (Representatives ORTITAY, OWLETT, RYAN and others) - State Government, January 22, 2020

OVER

This bill amends the Taxpayer-Funded Advertising Transparency Act, which requires certain notifications in media advertising.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

HOUSE

An Act designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 4021 over the Honeoye Creek, Sharon Township, Potter County, as the 2345 Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge. (Representatives CAUSER, BURNS, CALTAGIRONE and others) - Transportation, **January 22, 2020**

OVER

This bill designates a bridge on a portion of S.R. 4021 in Potter County as the Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge.

SENATE

607

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further providing for speed timing devices. (Senators SCAVELLO, MARTIN, BROWNE and others) - Transportation, December 9, 2019

OVER

This bill amends Title 75 to provide for speed timing devices.

SECOND CONSIDERATION URBAN AFFAIRS BILLS

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in home inspections, further providing for home inspection reports. (Representatives KORTZ, HELM, READSHAW and others) - Urban Affairs, December 16, 2019

OVER

This bill provides for home inspection reports.

SECOND CONSIDERATION URBAN AFFAIRS BILLS

HOUSE 1569 2939

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assessments of persons and property, providing for limitation on tax increase after countywide reassessment in cities and counties of the first class. (Representatives ISAACSON, WHITE, CALTAGIRONE and others) - Urban Affairs, February 4, 2020

C VOTE

This bill amends the Consolidated County Assessment Act to implement a cap of 10% on any increase in taxes collected after a county wide reassessment in Philadelphia.

SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS

432

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in interpretation and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in liability and compensation, further providing for compensation for post-traumatic stress injury. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BIZZARRO and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020

OVER

This bill requires post-traumatic stress injuries to be compensable under workers compensation for first responders, including 911 center dispatchers and call takers, and corrections officers.

HOUSE 759

An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for emergency response payment. (Representatives DUSH, JOZWIAK, GREINER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020 6

OVER

This bill authorizes Volunteer Fire Departments to bill for real and reasonable costs.

HOUSE 1236 3130

An Act regulating certain smoke alarms; providing for dwelling unit owner and tenant responsibilities; and prescribing penalties. (Representatives POLINCHOCK, FARRY, CIRESI and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 22, 2020

OVER

This bill creates the "Smoke Alarm Device Responsibility" Act by requiring approved smoke alarm devices that have nonremovable batteries with at least a 10-year life span.

SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS

HOUSE 1347

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in casualty insurance, further providing for billing. (Representatives MASSER, WHEELAND, IRVIN and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020

OVER

This bill requires insurance carriers to reimburse ambulance companies directly that are not in the insurance carrier's network.

THIRD CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILLS

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in preliminary 1836 provisions, further providing for definitions and for application; and, in exemptions, applicability and penalties, further providing for penalties. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, February 3, 2020 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

HOUSE

348

An Act providing for limited civil liability for agritourism activity providers, for notice of limited civil liability and for acknowledgment 3056 of limited civil liability. (Representatives GLEIM, GREINER, CAUSER and others) - Appropriations, December 18, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill creates limited liability protection for agritourism activity providers.

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in departmental powers and 3133 duties as to supervision, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants; and, in departmental powers and duties as to licensing, further providing for fees, providing for Keystone STARS Program participants and further providing for definition. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, SOLOMON, A. DAVIS and others) - Appropriations, January 21, 2020 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER



(Senators SCARNATI, HUTCHINSON, YAW and others) - Appropriations, January 21, 2020 Fiscal-Note



This bill creates the "Conventional Oil and Gas Wells Act" for the regulation of conventional oil and gas wells.

OVER

This bill amends Title 40 and Title 42 to provide consumer protections for annuity benefit plans.

THIRD CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILL

HOUSE 1850 2531

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for offenses committed with firearms and for sentences for certain drug offenses committed with firearms. (Representatives STEPHENS, QUINN, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, January 13, 2020 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends two provisions in the Judicial Code to restore a 5-year mandatory minimum sentence for violent crimes committed with firearms and drug deliveries committed with firearms.

OVER

This bill provides for the definitions of "injury," "personal injury" and "injury arising in the course of his employment," providing for diseases with long latency periods between occupational exposure and manifestation of the disease.



OVER

This bill amends the Administrative Code to establish processes and timelines relating to applications for individual permits, general permits, general permits and general plan approvals required by an environmental law.

HOUSE 1316 1535

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in taxation and finance, providing for spending limitations on the Commonwealth. (Representatives WARNER, BERNSTINE, BURNS and others) – Appropriations, December 16, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached



This bill amends the Constitution to establish limitations on the spending of Commonwealth funds.
