SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of June 18, 1982 (P.L.549, No.159), entitled "An act providing for the administration of certain 1434 Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program. (Representatives FEE, RYAN, BERNSTINE others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, February 5, 2020 3

This bill provides for the administration of certain Commonwealth farmland within the Department of Agriculture," further providing for agricultural land conservation assistance grant program.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILL

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, 2185 further providing for employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster parents. (Representative BOBACK) - Rules, **January 21, 2020**

This bill amends the Child Protective Services Law to provide for additional background check requirements and to restrict provisional employment arrangements.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **EDUCATION BILLS**

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of teachers, providing for a cultural competence continuing professional development course; and, in terms and courses of study, further providing for Holocaust, genocide and human rights violations instruction. (Representatives SOLOMON, GROVE, T. DAVIS and others) - Education, January 15, 2020

This bill amends the Public School Code to require the Department of Education to develop and implement a continuing professional education course on cultural awareness.

HOUSE 1800

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14). known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school district financial 2886 recovery, providing for duties of receivers in certain districts. (Representatives TURZAI. ROTHMAN. REESE and 3 others) - Education, February 5, 2020

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for a program of tuition grants for certain school districts in receivership.

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school security, further 2616 providing for school police officers powers and duties. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, STEPHENS, SNYDER and others) - Education, January 15, 2020 8

This bill amends the Public School Code to permit school police officers employed by a school district to exercise arrest powers if authorized by a court.

SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, January 21, 2020

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

HOUSE 1912 2660

An Act amending the act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), known as the Vital Statistics Law of 1953, in records, further providing for records and fees for copies. (Representatives ZIMMERMAN, READSHAW, JAMES and others) - Health, February 3, 2020

This bill amends the Vital Statistics Law to eliminate the fee for a death certificate for coroners in the performance of their official duties for unclaimed bodies.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS

HOUSE **564**

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health care accountability and protection, further providing for prompt payment of claims. (Representatives SAYLOR, RYAN, BARRAR and others) - Rules, January 14, 2020

This bill provides for prompt payment of claims.

HOUSE

1862 2795

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health care accountability and protection, providing for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills for health care services from out-of-network providers. (Representatives PICKETT, DeLUCA, BROWN and others) – Insurance, January 22, 2020 6

This bill provides for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills from health care services from out-of-network providers.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 111 1630

A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, ISAACSON and others) – Judiciary, January 13, 2020

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 1555 3006

Amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated States, in sentencing, further providing for order of probation and for modification or revocation of order of probation; in other criminal provisions, further providing for definitions and for supervisory relationship to offenders; and, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for supervisory relationship to offenders. (Representatives DELOZIER, HARRIS, JONES and others) - Judiciary, December 17, 2019

This bill amends Title 42 to limit probationary terms, set forth a procedure for the courts to apply when addressing probation violations, restricting the sanctions for probation violators, providing various means by which a person on probation can reduce the length of that probation, and applying these changes retroactively.

HOUSE 1851 2573

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for offenses committed with firearms and providing for sentences for persons not to possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms.. (Representatives STEPHENS, QUINN, BERNSTINE and others) – Judiciary, December 18, 2019

This bill amends two provisions in Title 42 to require mandatory minimum sentences for felons convicted of illegally possessing a firearm and to expand the definition of the term "crime of violence" to include the offense of a felon in possession of a firearm.

HOUSE 2040 2867

An Act providing for the PA Second Chance Jobs website and for powers and duties of the Department of Labor and Industry. (Representatives HARRIS, LEWIS, DELLOSO and others) – Judiciary, December 17, 2019

This bill creates the PA Second Chance Jobs website to provide a free and voluntary website where employers may advertise employment opportunities for former offenders.

An Act amending the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in crime victims, further providing for rights, for responsibilities of victims of crime under basic bill of rights, for responsibilities of State and local law enforcement agencies and for responsibilities of prosecutor's office; in administration, further providing for office, for powers and duties of victim advocate and for powers and duties of Office of Victims' Services; in parole advocacy, further providing for preparole notification to victim and for petitions to deny parole upon expiration of minimum sentence; in compensation, further providing for persons eligible for compensation, for filing of claims for compensation, for minimum allowable claim, for determination of

This bill amends the Public Employee Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

HOUSE 188

An Act providing for property owner's bill of rights statement.

(Representatives QUINN, COX, SIMMONS and others) - Local
Government, February 4, 2020

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This bill provides for property owner's bill of rights statement.

HOUSE

1074 1614

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, providing for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class. (Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) – Local Government, January 7, 2020 11

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILLS

HOUSE 2101 3257

An Act amending the act of May 23, 1945 (P.L.913, No.367), known as the Engineer, Land Surveyor and Geologist Registration Law, further providing for definitions, for procedure for licensing as professional engineer, for continuing professional competency requirements and for exemption from licensure and registration. (Representatives EMRICK, GILLEN, JOZWIAK and others) - Professional Licensure, March 23, 2020 1

This bill provides for definitions, for continuing professional competency requirements and for exemption form licensure and registration.

SENATE 67

An Act authorizing the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to join the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact; providing for the form of the compact; imposing additional powers and duties on the Governor, the Secretary of the Commonwealth and the Compact. (Senators J. WARD, BOSCOLA, PHILLIPS-HILL and others) - Professional Licensure, March 16, 2020 2

This bill authorizes the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to join the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact.

HOUSE

2039 2866

An Act amending the act of December 20, 2015 (P.L.497, No.90), known as the Taxpayer-Funded Advertising Transparency Act, further providing for definitions and for advertising notification; and making a related repeal. (Representatives ORTITAY, OWLETT, RYAN and others) – State Government, January 22, 2020 6

This bill amends the Taxpayer-Funded Advertising Transparency Act, which requires certain notifications in media advertising.

SENATE

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, in powers and duties of the Department of General Services and its departmental administrative and advisory boards and commissions, providing for report of State facilities owned or leased. (Senators ARGALL, SCAVELLO, FOLMER and others) - State Government, March 16, 2020

This bill requires the Department of General Services to conduct an annual survey of state facility usage.

An Act designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 4021 over the Honeoye Creek, Sharon Township, Potter County, as the 2345 Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge. (Representatives CAUSER, BURNS, CALTAGIRONE and others) - Transportation, January 22, 2020

This bill designates a bridge on a portion of S.R. 4021 in Potter County as the Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge.

HOUSE

An Act designating the Faxon Interchange of Interstate 180 at Northway Road in Loyalsock Township, Lycoming County, as the Sgt. Thomas Woodruff, Sr., and Sgt. Hamilton Woodruff Memorial **Interchange.** (Representatives WHEELAND, BURNS, HENNESSEY and others) - Transportation, March 16, 2020

This bill designates the Faxon Interchange of Interstate 180 in Lycoming County as the United States Army Sgt. Thomas H. Woodruff, Sr., and United States Marine Corps Sgt. Hamilton T. Woodruff Memorial Interchange.

HOUSE

An Act designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 32773, on that portion of U.S. Route 6 over the Tioga River, Mansfield 3035 Borough, Tioga County, as the Mansfield Veterans Memorial **Bridge.** (Representatives OWLETT, PICKETT, HENNESSEY and others) - Transportation, March 16, 2020

This bill designates a bridge over the Tioga River in Tioga County as the Mansfield Veterans Memorial Bridge.

HOUSE

An Act designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 5840, on that portion of SR 4010 (17th Street) over Interstate 99 in Logan 3085 Township, Blair County, as the Honorable Richard A. Geist Memorial Bridge. (Representatives SCHMITT, HENNESSEY, M. K. KELLER and others) - Transportation, March 16, 2020

This bill designates a bridge on a portion of S.R. 4010 in Blair County as the Honorable Richard A. Geist Memorial Bridge.

HOUSE

2195

An Act designating the bridge, identified as Bridge Key 57053, located over Dixon Run at the intersection of State Route 1012 to 3103 Pennsylvania Route 403 in Green Township, Indiana County, as the PVT William L. Hadden Memorial Bridge. (Representatives DUSH, HENNESSEY, HILL-EVANS and others) - Transportation, March 16, 2020

This bill designates a bridge over Dixon Run in Indiana County as the PVT William L. Hadden Memorial Bridge.

HOUSE 2217 3141

An Act designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 40269, on that portion of US 219 over State Route 2047, Summit Township, Somerset County, as the SP4 Michael William Twigg Memorial Bridge. (Representatives DOWLING, METZGAR, REESE and others) - Transportation, March 16, 2020 2

This bill designates a bridge on a portion of U.S. Route 219, over S.R. 2047, in Somerset County as the SP4 Michael William Twigg Memorial Bridge.

HOUSE

2256 3237

An Act designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 15279, on that portion of State Route 2025, also known as Morton Avenue, over Stony Creek in Morton Borough, Delaware County, as the Captain Michael Malinowski, Sr., Memorial Bridge. (Representatives O'MARA, SCHMITT, HILL-EVANS and others) - Transportation, March 16, 2020

This bill designates a bridge over Stoney Creek in Morton Borough, in Delaware County, as the Capt. Michael Malinowski, Sr., Memorial Bridge.

SENATE

607 1384 An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further providing for speed timing devices. (Senators SCAVELLO, MARTIN, BROWNE and others) – Transportation, March 23, 2020 1

This bill amends Title 75 to provide for speed timing devices.

SECOND CONSIDERATION URBAN AFFAIRS BILL

HOUSE 122 1012

An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in home inspections, further providing for home inspection reports. (Representatives KORTZ, HELM, READSHAW and others) – Urban Affairs, December 16, 2019

This bill provides for home inspection reports.

SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS

HOUSE 432 256

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in interpretation and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in liability and compensation, further providing for compensation for post-traumatic stress injury. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BIZZARRO and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020

This bill requires post-traumatic stress injuries to be compensable under workers compensation for first responders, including 911 center dispatchers and call takers, and corrections officers.

HOUSE

7<mark>59</mark> 2508 An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for emergency response payment. (Representatives DUSH, JOZWIAK, GREINER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020

This bill authorizes Volunteer Fire Departments to bill for real and reasonable costs.

HOUSE

1236 3130

An Act regulating certain smoke alarms; providing for dwelling unit owner and tenant responsibilities; and prescribing penalties. (Representatives POLINCHOCK, FARRY, CIRESI and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 22, 2020 6

This bill creates the "Smoke Alarm Device Responsibility" Act by requiring approved smoke alarm devices that have nonremovable batteries with at least a 10-year life span.

HOUSE

1347 2149

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in casualty insurance, further providing for billing. (Representatives MASSER, WHEELAND, IRVIN and others) – Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, January 14, 2020

This bill requires insurance carriers to reimburse ambulance companies directly that are not in the insurance carrier's network.

An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in preliminary 1836 provisions, further providing for definitions and for application; and, in exemptions, applicability and penalties, further providing for penalties. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, February 3, 2020 Fiscal-Note **Attached**

This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

An Act providing for limited civil liability for agritourism activity providers, for notice of limited civil liability and for acknowledgment of limited civil liability. (Representatives GLEIM, GREINER, CAUSER and others) - Appropriations, December 18, 2019 Fiscal-Note Attached 12

This bill creates limited liability protection for agritourism activity providers.

This bill provides for Keystone STARS Program participants.

An Act relating to conventional wells and the development of oil, gas and coal; imposing powers and duties on the Department of Environmental Protection; providing for preliminary provisions, for general requirements, for enforcement and remedies, for related funds and for miscellaneous provisions; and making an appropriation. This bill creates the "Conventional Oil and Gas Wells Act" for the regulation of conventional oil and gas wells.

This bill amends Title 40 and Title 42 to provide consumer protections for annuity benefit plans.

HOUSE 1850 2531

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for offenses committed with firearms and for sentences for certain drug offenses committed with firearms. (Representatives STEPHENS, QUINN, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, January 13, 2020 Fiscal-Note Attached

This bill amends two provisions in the Judicial Code to restore a 5-year mandatory minimum sentence for violent crimes committed with firearms and drug deliveries committed with firearms.
