





HOUSE An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of 2743 teachers, providing for a cultural competence continuing professional development course; and, in terms and courses of study, further providing for Holocaust, genocide and human rights violations instruction. (Representatives SOLOMON, GROVE, T. DAVIS and others) - Education, April 20, 2020 11

This bill amends the Public School Code to require the Department of Education to develop and implement a continuing professional education course on cultural awareness.

This bill amends the Public School Code to provide for a program of tuition grants for certain school districts in receivership.

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school security, further 2616 providing for school police officers powers and duties. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, STEPHENS, **SNYDER** and others) - Education, April 20, 2020 11

This bill amends the Public School Code to permit school police officers employed by a school district to exercise arrest powers if authorized by a court.

(Representatives TOPPER, SONNEY, SCHROEDER and others) – Education, May 5, 2020 4

This bill reforms PASSHE's legal and financial structure.

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.



HOUSE 1912 An Act amending the act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), known as the Vital Statistics Law of 1953, in records, further 2660 providing for records and fees for copies. (Representatives ZIMMERMAN, READSHAW, JAMES and others) - Health, April 28, 2020 8

OVER

This bill amends the Vital Statistics Law to eliminate the fee for a death certificate for coroners in the performance of their official duties for unclaimed bodies.

This bill provides for prompt payment of claims.

HOUSE An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), OVER known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health 2795 care accountability and protection, providing for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills for health care services from out-of-network providers. (Representatives PICKETT, DeLUCA, BROWN and others) - Insurance, April 27, 2020 9

This bill provides for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills from health care services from out-of-network providers.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 1111 1630 A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, ISAACSON and others) - Judiciary, April 14, 2020 13

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.

HOUSE 15555 3006 Amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated States, in sentencing, further providing for order of probation and for modification or revocation of order of probation; in other criminal provisions, further providing for definitions and for supervisory relationship to offenders; and, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for supervisory relationship to offenders. (Representatives DELOZIER, HARRIS, JONES and others) - Judiciary, May 14, 2020

This bill amends Title 42 to limit probationary terms, set forth a procedure for the courts to apply when addressing probation violations, restricting the sanctions for probation violators, providing various means by which a person on probation can reduce the length of that probation, and applying these changes retroactively.

HOUSE 1827 3696

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in criminal homicide, further providing for the offense of causing or aiding suicide. (Representatives KEEFER, RYAN, BERNSTINE and others) – Judiciary, May 12, 2020 3

This bill Amends Section 2505 of Title 18 to add a sentencing enhancement for a conviction of causing or aiding in suicide when the person who commits suicide is under 18 years old or has an intellectual disability.

HOUSE 1851 2573 An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for offenses committed with firearms and providing for sentences for persons not to possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms.. (Representatives STEPHENS, QUINN, BERNSTINE and others) – Judiciary, April 7, 2020 15

This bill amends two provisions in Title 42 to require mandatory minimum sentences for felons convicted of illegally possessing a firearm and to expand the definition of the term "crime of violence" to include the offense of a felon in possession of a firearm.

This bill amends Section 2703 of Title 18 to create the offense of harassment of law enforcement officer.

HOUSE 2040 2867 An Act providing for the PA Second Chance Jobs website and for powers and duties of the Department of Labor and Industry. (Representatives HARRIS, LEWIS, DELLOSO and others) – Judiciary, May 14, 2020 1

This bill creates the PA Second Chance Jobs website to provide a free and voluntary website where employers may advertise employment opportunities for former offenders.

HOUSE 2056 2969 An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of aggravated assault. (Representatives STRUZZI, BERNSTINE, BROOKS and others) – Judiciary, May 12, 2020 3

This bill amends Title 18 to provide that a person is guilty of aggravated assault if he causes bodily injury to an individual with a physical or intellectual disability.

An Act amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses), 23 (Domestic Relations) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of stalking; in wiretapping and electronic surveillance, further providing for definitions; in child custody, further providing for consideration of criminal conviction; in domestic and sexual violence victim address confidentiality, further providing for penalties; and, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for second and subsequent offenses. (Senators J. WARD, PHILLIPS-HILL, BREWSTER and others) - Judiciary, May 12, 2020 3

This bill amends Title 18, 23 & 42 to increase the possible criminal penalties for strangulation convictions and to permit judges to consider strangulation convictions in child custody proceedings.

This bill amends Title 18 to raise the potential criminal penalties for assaults on health care practitioners and technicians.

SENATE An Act amending the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, in preliminary provisions, 1424 further providing for definitions: in crime victims, further providing for rights, for responsibilities of victims of crime under basic bill of rights, for responsibilities of State and local law enforcement agencies and for responsibilities of prosecutor's office; in administration, further providing for office, for powers and duties of victim advocate and for powers and duties of Office of Victims' Services; in parole advocacy, further providing for preparole notification to victim and for petitions to deny parole upon expiration of minimum sentence; in compensation, further providing for persons eligible for compensation, for filing of claims for compensation, for minimum allowable claim, for determination of claims, for emergency awards, for awards and for confidentiality of records; in services, further providing for eligibility of victims; in financial matters, further providing for costs and for costs for offender supervision programs; and, in enforcement, further providing for subrogation. This bill amends the Crime Victims Act to make omnibus changes to victims' rights and compensation.

This bill amends the Public Employee Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.



(Representatives TURZAI, HENNESSEY, RYAN and others) - Local Government, April 13, 2020 14

This bill provides for governing bodies of airport authorities located in counties of the second class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE BILLS

An Act amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his designee to issue subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and further providing for civil penalties and license suspension," further providing for civil penalties. (Representatives KORTZ, KINSEY, MERSKI and others) - Professional Licensure, April 30, 2020 6

This bill provides for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs.

HOUSE 1947 2727 An Act amending the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), known as the Medical Practice Act of 1985, further providing for license without restriction. (Representatives KAUFER, BERNSTINE, PICKETT and others) - Professional Licensure, April 30, 2020 6

This bill amends Title 71 to provide for regulatory review and for regulatory pilot program.

HOUSE 1874 3534 An Act amending the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act, further providing for definitions and for classification of documents. (Representatives GROVE, JONES, MILLARD and others) - State Government, April 13, 2020 14

This bill provides for review of regulatory actions.

HOUSE 2039 2866 An Act amending the act of December 20, 2015 (P.L.497, No.90), known as the Taxpayer-Funded Advertising Transparency Act, further providing for definitions and for advertising notification; and making a related repeal. (Representatives ORTITAY, OWLETT, RYAN and others) - State Government, April 27, 2020 9

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This bill amends the Taxpayer-Funded Advertising Transparency Act, which requires certain notifications in media advertising.

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

This bill proposes an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, repealing provisions relating to disqualifications for service as election officer.

SENATE 703 1625 An Act amending Title 45 (Legal Notices) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in publication and effectiveness of Commonwealth documents, further providing for Joint Committee on Documents. (Senator SCARNATI) – State Government, April 13, 2020 14

This bill amends Title 45 to provide for Joint Committee on Documents.

HOUSE 1754 An Act designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 4021 over the Honeoye Creek, Sharon Township, Potter County, as the 2345 Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge. (Representatives CAUSER, BURNS, CALTAGIRONE and others) - Transportation, April 27, 2020 9

This bill designates a bridge on a portion of S.R. 4021 in Potter County as the Tec 5 C. Virgil Voorhees Memorial Bridge.

HOUSE An Act designating the Faxon Interchange of Interstate 180 at 2123 Northway Road in Loyalsock Township, Lycoming County, as the 3149 Sgt. Thomas Woodruff, Sr., and Sgt. Hamilton Woodruff Memorial Interchange. (Representatives WHEELAND, BURNS, HENNESSEY and others) - Transportation, May 4, 2020 5

This bill designates the Faxon Interchange of Interstate 180 in Lycoming County as the United States Army Sgt. Thomas H. Woodruff, Sr., and United States Marine Corps Sgt. Hamilton T. Woodruff Memorial Interchange.

SENATE An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further 1384 providing for speed timing devices. (Senators SCAVELLO, MARTIN, BROWNE and others) - Transportation, May 5, 2020 4

This bill amends Title 75 to provide for speed timing devices.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **URBAN AFFAIRS BILL**

HOUSE An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in home inspections, further 1012 providing for home inspection reports. (Representatives KORTZ, HELM, READSHAW and others) - Urban Affairs, May 13, 2 2020

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This bill provides for home inspection reports.

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SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS

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


An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in interpretation and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in liability and compensation, further providing for compensation for post-traumatic stress injury. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BIZZARRO and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, April 16, 2020 12

This bill requires post-traumatic stress injuries to be compensable under workers compensation for first responders, including 911 center dispatchers and call takers, and corrections officers.

HOUSE 759 2508 An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for emergency response payment. (Representatives DUSH, JOZWIAK, GREINER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, April 16, 2020 12

This bill authorizes Volunteer Fire Departments to bill for real and reasonable costs.



This bill creates the "Smoke Alarm Device Responsibility" Act by requiring approved smoke alarm devices that have nonremovable batteries with at least a 10-year life span.

HOUSE 1347 2149 An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in casualty insurance, further providing for billing. (Representatives MASSER, WHEELAND, IRVIN and others) – Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, April 16, 2020 12

This bill requires insurance carriers to reimburse ambulance companies directly that are not in the insurance carrier's network.




An Act amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions and for application; and, in exemptions, applicability and penalties, further providing for penalties. (Representatives LAWRENCE, CAUSER, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, April 28, 2020 Fiscal-Note Attached 8

This bill amends the PA Construction Code Act to exempt historic agricultural buildings, when used for private events and meeting certain safety provisions, from the provisions of the code.

HOUSE 1348 3056 An Act providing for limited civil liability for agritourism activity providers, for notice of limited civil liability and for acknowledgment of limited civil liability. (Representatives GLEIM, GREINER, CAUSER and others) - Appropriations, April 7, 2020 Fiscal-Note Attached 15

This bill creates limited liability protection for agritourism activity providers.



This bill amends the Administrative Code to add a new Article relating to Emergency COVID-19 provisions regarding extension of waiver provisions to animal grooming services.


