SECOND CONSIDERATION AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS BILL

SENATE 1182 2108 An Act amending the act of July 8, 1986 (P.L.437, No.92), known as the Pennsylvania Agricultural Fair Act, further providing for advisory committee; and providing for COVID-19 Emergency Agricultural Fair Grants. (Senators BROOKS, BARTOLOTTA, PITTMAN and others) - Agriculture & Rural Affairs, October 26, 2020 4

This bill creates a grant program to benefit agricultural fairs that were canceled due to the COVID-19 emergency.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN AND YOUTH BILL

HOUSE 1633 2185 An Act amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, further providing for employees having contact with children; adoptive and foster parents. (Representative BOBACK) - Rules, November 16, 2020 1

This bill amends the Child Protective Services Law to provide for additional background check requirements and to restrict provisional employment arrangements.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **COMMERCE BILLS**



434

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, providing for small business grant program, imposing duties on the Department of Community and **Economic Development** and making an appropriation. (Representatives CIRESI, SNYDER, HOHENSTEIN and others) - Commerce, November 10, 2020 3

This bill creates the Small Business Grant program under DCED.

HOUSE An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), 2491 known as The Administrative Code of 1929, providing for emergency 3722 COVID-19 provisions. (Representatives M. K. KELLER, CAUSER, SCHLEGEL CULVER and others) - Commerce, November 10, 2020 3

This bill creates waiver to permit auctioneers to work during the COVID-19 emergency.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **CONSUMER AFFAIRS BILL**

HOUSE 1718 An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in service and facilities, further providing **2310** for definitions. (Representatives A. DAVIS, HILL-EVANS, DeLUCA and others) - Consumer Affairs, September 11, 2020 15

This bill amends Title 66 further defining "landlord ratepayer".

SECOND CONSIDERATION **EDUCATION BILLS**

HOUSE An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in certification of 2743 teachers, providing for a cultural competence continuing professional development course; and, in terms and courses of study, further providing for Holocaust, genocide and human rights violations instruction. (Representatives SOLOMON, GROVE, T. DAVIS and others) - Education, November 12, 2020 2

This bill amends the Public School Code to require the Department of Education to develop and implement a continuing professional education course on cultural awareness.

SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS

HOUSE 1881 2616 An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school security, further providing for school police officers powers and duties. (Representatives KAUFFMAN, STEPHENS, SNYDER and others) - Education, November 12, 2020 2

This bill amends the Public School Code to permit school police officers employed by a school district to exercise arrest powers if authorized by a court.

SENATE 869 2045 An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in terms and courses of study, further providing for moment of silence on September 11 anniversary and for moment of silence on December 7, Pearl Harbor Day. (Senators MASTRIANO, STEFANO, REGAN and others) - Education, October 20, 2020 6

This bill provides for a moment of silence on September 11th anniversary and a moment of silence on December 7th Pearl Harbor Day.

SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILLS

An Act amending Title 58 (Oil and Gas) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in development, further providing for well permits. (Representatives OBERLANDER, FRITZ, JAMES and others) – Environmental Resources & Energy, November 16, 2020 1

This bill amends Title 58 to provide for cross unit drilling.



HOUSE 2004 3714 An Act amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.359, No.50), known as the Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund Act, further providing for definitions, for Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund, for duties, responsibilities and limitations on agencies, for allocation from fund and for waivers; and making related repeals. (Representatives ORTITAY, GROVE, RYAN and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, October 26, 2020 4

This bill requires the General Assembly to annually appropriate money in the Keystone Recreation, Park, and Conservation Fund among the grant programs instead of relying on a static funding schedule.





HOUSE 333 2917 An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income. (Representatives NELSON, GROVE, GAYDOS and others) – Finance, October 1, 2020 8

This bill provides for classes of income.



This bill provides for the definition of "building machinery and equipment."



This bill establishes the COVID-19 Disaster Emergency Business Interruption Grant Program.

HOUSE 2460 3794 An Act amending the act of May 25, 1945 (P.L.1050, No.394), known as the Local Tax Collection Law, further providing for interim assessment, duplicate and warrant, for discounts, penalties and notice, and for collectors required to be in attendance. (Representatives STEPHENS, BROWN, MALAGARI and others) - Finance, November 10, 2020 3

This bill amends the Local Tax Collection Law to provide school district real estate tax relief for assessments issued for 2020.



An Act amending the act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), known as the Vital Statistics Law of 1953, in records, further providing for records and fees for copies. (Representatives ZIMMERMAN, READSHAW, JAMES and others) - Health, **September 15, 2020** 14


This bill amends the Vital Statistics Law to eliminate the fee for a death certificate for coroners in the performance of their official duties for unclaimed bodies.

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), 2476 known as the Human Services Code, in health care outcomes, further 3689 providing for establishment, for value-based models relating to the Hospital Outcomes Program, for value-based models relating to the Managed Care Organization Outcomes Program and for managed care organization Medicaid contracts. (Representatives GROVE, RYAN, JONES and others) - Health, October 1, 2020

This bill amends the Human Services Code to update the Healthcare Outcomes Program and establish the Targeted Savings Program for medical assistance/Medicaid.



This bill amends the Administrative Code to extend waiver provisions for health care providers.





This bill creates a free-standing Extension of Waiver Provisions for Pediatric Services Act.

HOUSE 2779 An Act providing for retaining health care innovations during the COVID-19 pandemic and imposing duties on the Joint State 4382 Government Commission. (Representatives QUINN, THOMAS, HEFFLEY and others) - Health, September 23, 2020 11

This bill creates a freestanding act to maintain health care innovations used during the COVID-19 pandemic.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILLS



This bill amends the Human Services Code to require an individual enrolled in Medical assistance remain with the same managed care organization for one year, or until such time as one is no longer eligible.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HUMAN SERVICES BILLS

HOUSE 2187 3797 An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in children and youth, providing for Statewide children's mental health ombudsman. (Representatives GALLOWAY, T. DAVIS, ULLMAN and others) – Human Services, November 16, 2020 1

This bill provides for a Statewide children's mental health ombudsman.

SENATE 983 2000 An Act amending the act of September 9, 1965 (P.L.497, No.251), known as the Newborn Child Testing Act, further providing for definitions and for Newborn Child Screening and Follow-up Program; and providing for mandated screening and follow-up. (Senators DiSANTO, BROWNE, MENSCH and others) - Human Services, October 26, 2020 4

This bill provides for Newborn Child Screening and Follow-up Program.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS

HOUSE 564 2284 An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health care accountability and protection, further providing for prompt payment of claims. (Representatives SAYLOR, RYAN, BARRAR and others) - Rules, November 10, 2020 3

This bill provides for prompt payment of claims.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILLS



An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in quality health care accountability and protection, providing for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills for health care services from out-of-network providers. (Representatives PICKETT, DeLUCA, BROWN and others) – Insurance, September 11, 2020 15

This bill provides for protections for consumers receiving surprise balance bills from health care services from out-of-network providers.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE A Joint Resolution proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions relating to selection of justices and judges. (Representatives SCHEMEL, McCLINTON, ISAACSON and others) - Judiciary, October 26, 2020 4

This bill is a Joint Resolution amending Article V of the PA Constitution to provide for the appointment of justices to the Supreme Court and judges to the Superior and Commonwealth Courts and establishing the Appellate Court Nominating Commission.



Amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for order of probation and for modification or revocation of order of probation; in other criminal provisions, further providing for definitions and for supervisory relationship to offenders; and, in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, further providing for supervisory relationship to offenders. (Representatives DELOZIER, HARRIS, JONES and others) - Judiciary, October 19, 2020 7

This bill amends Title 42 to limit probationary terms, set forth a procedure for the courts to apply when addressing probation violations, restricting the sanctions for probation violators, providing various means by which a person on probation can reduce the length of that probation, and applying these changes retroactively.

HOUSE 1655 3695 An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in riot, disorderly conduct and related offenses, providing for concurrent jurisdiction to prosecute. (Representatives ISAACSON, STEPHENS, CIRESI and others) - Judiciary, October 26, 2020 4

This bill creates Section 5562 in Title 18 to provide that the Attorney General has concurrent jurisdiction to investigate and institute criminal proceedings under chapter 55, subchapter B.

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for sentences for offenses committed with firearms and providing for sentences for persons not to possess, use, manufacture, control, sell or transfer firearms.. (Representatives STEPHENS, QUINN, BERNSTINE and others) – Judiciary, October 20, 2020 6

This bill amends two provisions in Title 42 to require mandatory minimum sentences for felons convicted of illegally possessing a firearm and to expand the definition of the term "crime of violence" to include the offense of a felon in possession of a firearm.

HOUSE 2040 2867 An Act providing for the PA Second Chance Jobs website and for powers and duties of the Department of Labor and Industry. (Representatives HARRIS, LEWIS, DELLOSO and others) – Judiciary, October 19, 2020 7

This bill creates the PA Second Chance Jobs website to provide a free and voluntary website where employers may advertise employment opportunities for former offenders.

An Act amending the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, in preliminary provisions, 1424 further providing for definitions; in crime victims, further providing for rights, for responsibilities of victims of crime under basic bill of rights, for responsibilities of State and local law enforcement agencies and for responsibilities of prosecutor's office; in administration, further providing for office, for powers and duties of victim advocate and for powers and duties of Office of Victims' Services; in parole advocacy, further providing for preparole notification to victim and for petitions to deny parole upon expiration of minimum sentence; in compensation, further providing for persons eligible for compensation, for filing of claims for compensation, for minimum allowable claim, for determination of claims, for emergency awards, for awards and for confidentiality of records; in services, further providing for eligibility of victims; in financial matters, further providing for costs and for costs for offender supervision programs; and, in enforcement, further providing for subrogation. (Senators BARTOLOTTA, HUGHES, HAYWOOD and others) - Judiciary, October 1, 2020 8

This bill amends the Crime Victims Act to make omnibus changes to victims' rights and compensation.

HOUSE 785 856 An Act amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, further providing for definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations; and making related repeals. (Representatives KLUNK, RYAN, MOUL and others) - Labor & Industry, November 12, 2020 2

This bill amends the Public Employee Relations Act to require specific disclosure of employee rights; repeals unenforceable laws related to fair share fees.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSEAn Act providing for property owner's bill of rights statement.188(Representatives QUINN, COX, SIMMONS and others) - Local
Government, September 16, 202013

This bill provides for property owner's bill of rights statement.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILLS

HOUSE 995 3533 An Act amending Title 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for regulatory review and for regulatory reduction pilot program; and making an editorial change. (Representatives LEWIS, KENYATTA, GROVE and others) - State Government, October 21, 2020 5

This bill amends Title 71 to provide for regulatory review and for regulatory pilot program.

HOUSE 1874 3534 An Act amending the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act, further providing for definitions and for classification of documents. (Representatives GROVE, JONES, MILLARD and others) - State Government, October 21, 2020 5

This bill provides for review of regulatory actions.

SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILLS



An Act amending the act of December 20, 2015 (P.L.497, No.90),
known as the Taxpayer-Funded Advertising Transparency Act,
further providing for definitions and for advertising notification;
and making a related repeal. (Representatives ORTITAY, OWLETT,

This bill amends the Taxpayer-Funded Advertising Transparency Act, which requires certain notifications in media advertising.

An Act providing for liability for false claims, for adoption of congressional intent of the Federal False Claims Act, for damages, costs and civil penalties, for powers of Attorney General, for civil investigative demands and for COVID-19-related liability. (Representatives GROVE, KAUFER, GAYDOS and others) – State Government, October 01, 2020 8

This bill establishes the Commonwealth Fraud Prevention Act and amends the Human Services Code pertaining to liability for false claims.



This bill amends Title 71 to change the definition of "enforcement officer" in the State Employees' Retirement Code to include PA Department of Military and Veterans Affairs Indiantiown Gap Installation Police Officers.

HOUSE 2431 3672 An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, in emergency finance and tax provisions, providing for local taxation on real property, for reopening of 2019-2020 school district budgets and for charter school tuition rate for the 2020-2021 school year. (Representatives GLEIM, CUTLER, LEWIS and others) - State Government, September 29, 2020 10

This bill provides for local taxation on real property and for reopening of 2019-2020 school district budgets.

SENATE 703 1625 An Act amending Title 45 (Legal Notices) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in publication and effectiveness of Commonwealth documents, further providing for Joint Committee on Documents. (Senator SCARNATI) - State Government, October 21, 2020 5

This bill amends Title 45 to provide for Joint Committee on Documents.

SENATE 1214 1783 An Act authorizing the Department of General Services, with the approval of the Department of Corrections and the Governor, to grant and convey to the Schuylkill County Municipal Authority an easement from lands of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at the State Correctional Institution Mahanoy situate in Mahanoy Township, County of Schuylkill, for the purpose of establishing, utilizing, and maintaining water wells and appurtenances thereto related to potable water production and distribution for the benefit of customers within the authority's service territory. (Senator ARGALL) - State Government, September 23, 2020 11

This bill authorizes the Department of General Services, with the approval of the Department of Corrections and the Governor, to grant and convey to the Schuylkill County Municipal Authority an easement from lands of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at the State Correctional Institution Mahanoy situate in Mahanoy Township, County of Schuylkill, for the purpose of establishing, utilizing, and maintaining water wells and appurtenances thereto related to potable water production and distribution for the benefit of customers within the authority's service territory.

This bill amends Title 75 to provide for speed timing devices.

An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in home inspections, further providing for home inspection reports. (Representatives KORTZ, HELM, READSHAW and others) - Urban Affairs, October 1, 2020 8

This bill provides for home inspection reports.

HOUSE 1559 2042 An Act amending the act of July 7, 1947 (P.L.1368, No.542), known as the Real Estate Tax Sale Law, adding provisions relating to bidder registration before sale; and, in sale of property, further providing for date of sale, for repurchase by owner, for restrictions on purchases and for sale of property in repository. (Representatives HEFFLEY, SCHMITT, DeLUCA and others) - Rules, September 17, 2020 12

This bill provides for date of sale, for repurchase by owner, for restrictions on purchases and for sale of property in repository.


HOUSE 432 2568 An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in interpretation and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in liability and compensation, further providing for compensation for post-traumatic stress injury. (Representatives BARRAR, SAINATO, BIZZARRO and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, November 10, 2020 3

This bill requires post-traumatic stress injuries to be compensable under workers compensation for first responders, including 911 center dispatchers and call takers, and corrections officers.

HOUSE 759 2508 An Act amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in emergency management services, providing for emergency response payment. (Representatives DUSH, JOZWIAK, GREINER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, November 10, 2020 3

This bill authorizes Volunteer Fire Departments to bill for real and reasonable costs.

SECOND CONSIDERATION VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILLS



This bill creates the "Smoke Alarm Device Responsibility" Act by requiring approved smoke alarm devices that have nonremovable batteries with at least a 10-year life span.

HOUSE 1347 2149 An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in casualty insurance, further providing for billing. (Representatives MASSER, WHEELAND, IRVIN and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, November 10, 2020 3

This bill requires insurance carriers to reimburse ambulance companies directly that are not in the insurance carrier's network.

An Act amending the act of October 31, 2006 (P.L.1210, No.133), known as the Price Gouging Act, further providing for definitions, for price gouging prohibited and for investigation. (Senators J. WARD, SCARNATI, LANGERHOLC and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, October 21, 2020 5

This bill provides for definitions, for price gouging prohibited and for investigation.

An Act amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in veterans' preference, repealing provisions 2043 relating to soldier defined, providing for purpose and for definitions, repealing provisions relating to credits in civil service examinations, further providing for additional points in grading civil service examinations, for preference in appointment or promotion, for lack of training, age or physical impairment, for preferential rating provision in public works specifications, for computation of seniority for reduction in force, for preference of spouses and for law exclusive and providing for reporting requirement and for guidelines; and, in voluntary veterans' preference in private employment, further providing for definitions and for eligibility for REGAN. preference. (Senators AUMENT. BAKER and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, September 23, 2020 11

This bill modernizes our State Veterans Preference Law.

This bill creates limited liability protection for agritourism activity providers.
