# SECOND CONSIDERATION AGING AND OLDER ADULT SERVICES BILL

**SENATE 729** 

An Act amending the act of June 9, 1997 (P.L.169, No.14), known as the Nurse Aide Resident Abuse Prevention Training Act, further providing for implementation. (Senators J. WARD, BROOKS, MENSCH and others) - Aging & Older Adult Services, December 13, 2021

CO VOTE

This bill provides for Online Education & Nurse Aide Training Program.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION COMMERCE BILL

**HOUSE 424** 

An Act amending the act of July 9, 1970 (P.L.484, No.164), entitled "An act relating to indemnification agreements between architects, engineers or surveyors and owners, contractors, subcontractors or suppliers," further providing for title of act; and providing for indemnification agreements relative to construction contracts, including agreements for architectural, engineering or land surveying services. (Representatives STEPHENS, DRISCOLL, ZABEL and others) - Rules, December 14, 2021

OVER

This bill amends the act of July 9, 1970 providing for indemnification agreements relative to construction contracts.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILLS

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school districts, further providing for how constituted. (Representatives MUSTELLO, STRUZZI, ROWE and others) - Education, November 16, 2021 4

**OVER** 

This bill amends the Public School Code to permit a school district to change its name.

HOUSE 1254 1328

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in terms and courses of study, providing for in-person instruction or tuition grant program required. (Representatives LEWIS DELROSSO, ROTHMAN, WHITE and others) – Education, December 13, 2021

**OVER** 

This bill amends the Public School Code to require a school district to create a tuition grant program for resident students.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY BILL

HOUSE 2075 2398

An Act providing for the abrogation of regulations relating to the Pennsylvania Heavy-Duty Diesel Emissions Control Program and for the applicability of Federal standards. (Representatives KNOWLES, STAMBAUGH, R. MACKENZIE and others) - Environmental Resources & Energy, November 16, 2021

C VOTE

This bill eliminates regulation adopting California diesel heavy-duty truck standards.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS

**HOUSE 359** 

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, in emergency finance and tax provisions, providing for exemption from taxation. (Representatives MARKOSEK, HILL-EVANS, A. DAVIS and others) - Finance, November 8, 2021

OVER

This bill amends the Fiscal Code to exclude economic recovery payments issued under the Federal Coronavirus Aid Act or the Federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, from consideration as income, earned income or taxable income.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION FINANCE BILLS

**385** 

An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, in personal income tax, further providing for classes of income. (Representatives DUNBAR, ROTHMAN, BROOKS and others) - Finance, November 8, 2021

**OVER** 

This bill amends the Tax Reform Code to exclude an amount of loan forgiveness granted under the Federal Coronavirus Aid Act or the Federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, from state income tax.

HOUSE 1151

An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, in powers and duties of the Department of Revenue, repealing provisions relating to vehicle and tractor codes. (Representatives O'NEAL, OWLETT, RYAN and others) – Finance, November 10, 2021

**OVER** 

This bill provides for powers and duties of the Department of Revenue, repealing provisions relating to vehicle and tractor codes.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION GAME AND FISHERIES BILL

HOUSE 1108 1147

An Act amending Title 30 (Fish) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in fishing licenses, further providing for exemptions from license requirements. (Representatives NEILSON, ECKER, KULIK and others) - Game & Fisheries, November 10, 2021



This bill provides for exemptions from license requirements.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

**HOUSE 2033** 

An Act providing for COVID-19 testing; and making an inconsistent repeal. (Representatives LAWRENCE, GROVE, JAMES and others) - Health, December 14, 2021

VOTE

This bill creates the COVID-19 Testing Act.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION **INSURANCE BILL**

**HOUSE** 1665

An Act amending the act of July 9, 1970 (P.L.484, No.164), entitled "An act relating to indemnification agreements between 2406 architects, engineers or surveyors and owners, contractors, subcontractors or suppliers," further providing for title of act and providing for indemnification agreements relating to snow removal or ice control services. (Representatives QUINN, ZIMMERMAN, MALAGARI and others) - Insurance, November 17, 2021

OVER

This bill provides for enforceability of certain indemnity provisions in certain snow removal and ice control services contracts relating to commercial property.

### **SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS**

**HOUSE** 659

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in firearms and other dangerous 1536 articles, repealing provisions relating to firearms not to be carried without a license, providing for license not required, repealing provisions relating to carrying firearms on public streets or public property in Philadelphia, providing for sportsman's firearm permit, further providing for licenses and repealing provisions relating to proof of license and exception. (Representatives BERNSTINE, MALONEY, GREGORY and others) - Judiciary, November 17, 3 2021

OVER

This bill amends Chapter 61 of Title 18 to provide for "constitutional carry" of a firearm.

HOUSE

1587

An Act amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1761 Statutes, in assault, providing for arrests of previously convicted persons possessing firearms in a subsequent offense; and, in sentencing, providing for sentences for previously convicted persons possessing firearms in a subsequent offense. (Representatives A. BROWN, KAUFFMAN, STEPHENS and others) - Rules, November 15, 2021

OVER

This bill provides for arrests of previously convicted persons possessing firearms in a subsequent offense.

**HOUSE** 

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in dispositions 2066 independent of letters, family exemption, probate of wills and grant of letters, further providing for payments to family and funeral directors. (Representatives BONNER, BERNSTINE, CAUSER and others) - Judiciary, December 14, 2021

VOTE

This bill amends Title 20 to provide for payments to family and funeral directors.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 1985 2384

An Act amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in wiretapping and electronic surveillance, further providing for exceptions to prohibition of interception and disclosure of communications. (Representatives BONNER, ROWE, C. WILLIAMS and others) – Judiciary, December 14, 2021

C)

This bill amends the Wiretap Act under Title 18 to permit individuals to intercept the oral communications of telemarketers for the purpose of enforcing consumer protection laws.

HOUSE 2016 2328

An Act amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in dispositions independent of letters, family exemption and probate of wills and grant of letters, further providing for settlement of small estates on petition. (Representatives MUSTELLO AND ECKER) – Judiciary, December 14, 2021



This bill provides for settlement of small estates on petition.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILL

HOUSE **1407** 

An Act amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, in licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages, further providing for renewal of licenses and temporary provisions for licensees in armed service and for rights of municipalities preserved. (Representatives JONES, MOUL, ZIMMERMAN and others) - Rules, October 27, 2021

OVER

This bill provide for a 75 decibel limit for noise for licensees in Class 2A-8 counties.

# SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE 1877

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in alteration of territory or corporate entity and dissolution, providing for municipal boundary change; and making related repeals. (Representatives FREEMAN, JAMES, MOUL and others) - Local Government, December 14, 2021



This bill amends Title 53 to establish the Municipal Boundary Change Act.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILLS

**HOUSE** 71

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in taxation and finance, providing for spending limitations on the Commonwealth. (Representatives WARNER, DAVANZO, **DIAMOND** and others) - State Government, November 17, 2021 3

OVER

This is a Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in taxation and finance, providing for spending limitations on the Commonwealth.

**HOUSE** 

**1278** 

An Act granting authority to sports organizations relating to mask wearing during sporting events. (Representatives DAVANZO. COX, DIAMOND and others) - State Government, September 29, 2021

OVER

This bill grants authority to sports organizations relating to mask wearing during sporting events.

**HOUSE** 

1482

An Act amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, in preliminary provisions, 1600 establishing the Bureau of Election Audits; in the Secretary of the Commonwealth, providing for reports on implementation of elections; and, in electronic voting systems, repealing provisions relating to statistical sample. (Representatives CUTLER, RYAN, ROWE and others) - State Government, December 13, 2021

OVER

This bill establishes the Bureau of Election Audits.

HOUSE 1596

A Joint Resolution proposing separate and distinct and integrated amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for qualifications of electors, for method of elections and secrecy in voting and for election and registration laws and providing for election audits and for the election and qualifications of the Secretary of the Commonwealth. (Representatives WHEELAND, STAATS, R. MACKENZIE and others) - State Government, October 4, 2021 14

OVER

This is a Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania providing for qualifications of electors.

HOUSE 2069 2390

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Pennsylvania, further providing for action on concurrent orders and resolutions. (Representatives CUTLER, RYAN, HAMM and others) - State Government, December 13, 2021

OVER

This is a Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Pennsylvania, further providing for action on concurrent orders and resolutions.

HOUSE 2070 2391

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Pennsylvania, providing for executive orders. (Representatives CUTLER, RYAN, HAMM and others) – State Government, December 13, 2021

**OVER** 

This is a Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Pennsylvania, providing for executive orders.

SENATE 106

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for Lieutenant Governor. (Senators ARGALL, STREET, MARTIN and others) - State Government, December 14, 2021

VOTE



This is a joint resolution proposing an amendment to the PA Constitution, further providing for Lieutenant Governor.

**SENATE 738** 

An Act amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, in the Secretary of the Commonwealth, further providing for explanation of ballot question. (Senators PHILLIPS-HILL, ARGALL, BAKER and others) – State Government, December 13, 2021

OVER

This bill provides for explanation of ballot question.

# SECOND CONSIDERATION TOURISM AND RECREATIONAL DEV. BILL

HOUSE 1694

An Act amending the act of February 2, 1966 (1965 P.L.1860, No.586), entitled "An act encouraging landowners to make land and water areas available to the public for recreational purposes by limiting liability in connection therewith, and repealing certain acts," further providing for definitions, for duty to keep premises safe and warning and for assurance of safe premises and duty of care and responsibility and liability. (Representatives STRUZZI, DRISCOLL, WHITE and others) - Tourism & Recreational Development, December 14, 2021

C)

This bill amends the Recreational Use of Land and Water Act to provide protections for volunteers, volunteer organizations, and those that landowners invite onto their property in order to improve the property, without compensation, for recreational use.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for learners' permits and for examination of applicant for driver's license; in rules of the road in general, further providing for prohibiting text-based communications, providing for prohibiting use of interactive wireless communications devices and imposing penalties; and, in operation of vehicles miscellaneous provisions, further providing for the offense of homicide by vehicle and for the offense of aggravated assault by vehicle. (Representatives R. BROWN, MALAGARI, BOBACK and others) - Transportation, September 29, 2021

**OVER** 

This bill bans the use of handheld cellphones while driving.

HOUSE 151

An Act designating the portion of State Route 2038, also known as Fitzwatertown Road, between Jenkintown Road and North Hills Avenue in Upper Dublin Township, Montgomery County, as the CPL Vincent J. Wargo, Jr., U.S.M.C. Memorial Highway. (Representatives SANCHEZ, BURNS, RYAN and others) - Transportation, November 8, 2021

OVER

This bill designates the portion of State Route 2038, also known as Fitzwatertown Road, between Jenkintown Road and North Hills Avenue in Upper Dublin Township, Montgomery County, as the CPL Vincent J. Wargo, Jr., U.S.M.C. Memorial Highway.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

**HOUSE 152** 

An Act designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 43267, on that portion of State Route 3041, also known as Dishong Mountain 117 Road, over U.S. Route 22 in Jackson Township, Cambria County, as the Technical Sergeant Mike Capelli Memorial Bridge. BURNS, (Representatives GUENST, KINSEY and others) - Transportation, November 8, 2021 8

OVER

This bill designates a bridge on that portion of State Route 3041, also known as Dishong Mountain Road, over U.S. Route 22 in Jackson Township, Cambria County, as the Technical Sergeant Mike Capelli Memorial Bridge.

**HOUSE 371** 

An Act designating the portion of Pennsylvania Route 837, also known as Duquesne Boulevard, between Center Street in the City of Duquesne, Allegheny County, and Hoffman Boulevard in West Mifflin Borough, Allegheny County, as the Clifton P. Pitts Memorial Highway. (Representatives A. DAVIS, LEE, PISCIOTTANO and others) - Transportation, October 6, 2021 12

OVER

This bill designates the portion of Pennsylvania Route 837, also known as Duquesne Boulevard, between Center Street in the City of Duquesne, Allegheny County, and Hoffman Boulevard in West Mifflin Borough, Allegheny County, as the Clifton P. Pitts Memorial Highway.

HOUSE

An Act designating a roundabout at Pennsylvania Route 34, Spring Road, Pennsylvania Route 850, Valley Road, and Pisgah State Road in Carroll Township, Perry County, as the Shane E. **Troutman Memorial Roundabout.** (Representatives STAMBAUGH, BURNS, CONKLIN and others) - Transportation, September 29, 2021

OVER

This bill designates a roundabout at Pennsylvania Route 34, Spring Road, Pennsylvania Route 850, Valley Road, and Pisgah State Road in Carroll Township, Perry County, as the Shane E. Troutman Memorial Roundabout.

**HOUSE** 

1641

An Act designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 8517, carrying Pennsylvania Route 403 over the Stonycreek River in 1825 Ferndale Borough, Cambria County, as the Private First Class Lee David Meadows Memorial Bridge. (Representatives RIGBY, E. NELSON, SMITH and others) - Transportation, October 25, 2021 11

OVER

This bill designates a bridge carrying Pennsylvania Route 403 over the Stonycreek River in Ferndale Borough, Cambria County, as the Private First Class Lee David Meadows Memorial Bridge.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

HOUSE 1727 1955

An Act designating a portion of State Route 2019, known as Nyes Road, from the intersection of Derry Street to the intersection of Union Deposit Road, in Swatara and Lower Paxton Townships, Dauphin County, as the Glenn A. Martin Memorial Highway. (Representatives LEWIS, KAUFFMAN, SMITH and others) - Transportation, October 25, 2021

**OVER** 

This bill designates a portion of State Route 2019, known as Nyes Road, from the intersection of Derry Street to the intersection of Union Deposit Road, in Swatara and Lower Paxton Townships, Dauphin County, as the Glenn A. Martin Memorial Highway.

HOUSE

1830 2074

An Act designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 25507, on that portion of State Route 3006 over the Kinzua Creek in the census-designated place of Westline, Lafayette Township, McKean County, as the Westline Veterans Memorial Bridge. (Representatives CAUSER, RAPP, BOROWICZ and others) – Transportation, October 25, 2021

OVER

This bill designates a bridge on that portion of State Route 3006 over the Kinzua Creek in the census-designated place of Westline, Lafayette Township, McKean County, as the Westline Veterans Memorial Bridge.

### THIRD CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILL

HOUSE 681 1187

An Act prohibiting enforcement of covenants not to compete in health care practitioner employment agreements. (Representatives ECKER, BROOKS, BERNSTINE and others) - Appropriations, November 17, 2021 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill prohibits enforcement of covenants not to compete in health care practitioner employment agreements.

### THIRD CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILL

1590 1747

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for sentencing generally. (Representatives STEPHENS, BROOKS, DeLUCA and others) - Appropriations, November 16, 2021 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill amends Title 42 to make sentencing guidelines presumptive for certain offenses involving firearms.

# THIRD CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

**HOUSE 922** 

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in liability and compensation, further providing for compensable injuries, subrogation and proration. (Representatives DAVANZO, DUNBAR, KAUFFMAN and others) - Appropriations, October 4, 2021 Fiscal-Note Attached

**OVER** 

This bill amends the Workers' Compensation Act to provide employers or their insurance the right to treat a third-party settlement related to a workers' compensation claim as a credit for future medical costs.

# THIRD CONSIDERATION STATE GOVERNMENT BILLS

**746** 

An Act limiting assignment of State-owned vehicles.


(Representatives ROAE, ROWE, THOMAS and others) - Appropriations, September 29, 2021 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill establishes limitations on State-Owned vehicles used by Members of the General Assembly.

HOUSE 1800 2431

An Act amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, as follows: in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions, providing for legislative authority over elections, establishing the Bureau of Election Audits and providing for special standing in challenges to the Election Code; in the Secretary of the Commonwealth, further providing for powers and duties of the Secretary of the Commonwealth and providing for reports on implementation of elections; in county boards of elections, further providing for powers and duties of county boards and providing for county boards of elections and satellite offices; in district election officers, further providing for district election boards and election, for qualifications of election officers, for tie votes for judge and inspector, for clerks of election and machine inspectors, for vacancies in election boards, appointment, judge and majority inspector to be members of majority party and minority inspector to be member of minority party, for election officers to be sworn, for oath of judge of election, for oaths of inspectors of election, for oaths of clerks of election, for oath of machine inspectors, for power of election officers to administer oaths, for compensation of district election officers and for appointment of watchers; in election districts and polling places, further providing for polling places to be selected by county board, for public buildings to be used where possible and portable polling places and for temporary polling places; providing for registration of electors; in ballots, further providing for form of official election ballot and for number of ballots to be printed and specimen ballots; in voting machines, further providing for examination and approval

of voting machines by the Secretary of the Commonwealth, for requirements of voting machines, for preparation of voting machines by county election boards and for delivery of voting machines and supplies by county election boards to election officers; in electronic voting systems, further providing for experimental use of electronic voting systems and for statistical sample and providing for requirements of accessible voting machines and for voting system defects, disclosure, investigation and penalties; repealing provisions relating to voting apparatus bonds and providing for election equipment funding; in preparation for and conduct of primaries and elections, providing for voter's bill of rights, for senior voter's bill of rights and for disabled voter's bill of rights and further providing for delivery of ballots and supplies to judges of election, for time for opening and closing polls, for opening of polls, posting cards of instruction and notices of penalties and voters' rights and examination of voting machines, for manner of applying to vote, persons entitled to vote, voter's certificates, entries to be made in district register, numbered lists of voters and challenges, for assistance in voting and for deadline for receipt of valid voter registration application; in voting by qualified absentee electors, further providing for applications for official absentee ballots, for date of application for absentee ballot, for delivering or mailing ballots and for voting by absentee electors, providing for supervised voting by qualified absentee electors in certain facilities and further providing for canvassing of official absentee ballots and mail-in ballots; in voting by qualified mail-in electors, further providing for applications for official mail-in ballots, for date of application for mail-in ballot, for delivering or mailing ballots and for voting by mail-in electors; in Pennsylvania Election Law Advisory Board, further providing for Pennsylvania Election Law Advisory Board; providing for early voting by qualified electors; in returns of primaries and elections, further providing for returns to be open to public inspection and exceptions and for computation of returns by county board, certification and issuance of certificates of election; in recounts and contest, providing for powers and duties of the Attorney General relating to elections and for powers and duties of district attorneys relating to elections; in penalties, further providing for disobeying lawful instructions, for perjury, for false affidavits of candidates, for refusal to permit inspection of papers, destruction or removal and Secretary of the Commonwealth, for refusal to permit inspection of papers, destruction or removal and county boards of elections, for insertion and alteration of entries in documents, removal and refusal to deliver, for refusal to permit overseers, watchers, attorneys or candidates to act, for driving away watchers, attorneys, candidates or overseers, for refusal to permit election officers, clerks and machine inspectors to act and driving away said persons, for refusal to administer oath and acting without being sworn, for violation of oath of office by election officers, for peace officers, failure to render assistance and hindering or delaying county board members and others, for nomination petitions and papers and offenses by signers, for false signatures and statements in nomination petitions and papers, for nomination petitions,
