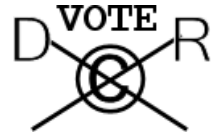

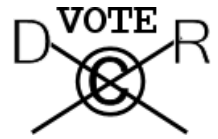

(Representatives FRANKEL, N. NELSON, McNEILL and others) – **Judiciary, June 20, 2023** **11**



This bill expands protections for hate-based intimidation and requires police training to identify hate-based intimidation.

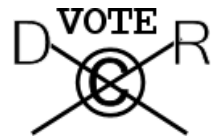
An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in Safe2Say Program, further providing for definitions and for Safe2Say Program; in postsecondary institution sexual harassment and sexual violence policy and online reporting system, further providing for definitions, for policy for postsecondary institution sexual harassment and sexual violence and for online reporting system; and making an editorial change. (Representatives N. NELSON, FRANKEL, McNEILL and others) – **Judiciary, June 20, 2023** **11**



This bill expands existing anonymous reporting programs in K-12 schools, along with institutions of higher education.

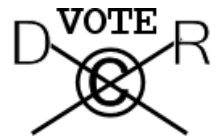
An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, providing for sentencing for hate-based intimidation and for community impact statements. (Representatives FRANKEL, N. NELSON, McNEILL and others) – **Judiciary, June 20, 2023** **11**



This bill allows a court to require educational instruction or community service for a person who has been convicted of hate-based intimidation.

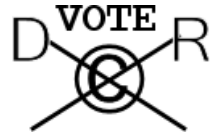


This bill strengthens the criminal ethnic intimidation statute and civil rights violation statute regarding ethnic intimidation.

This bill requires police to wear ballistic body armor for protection during high risk law enforcement activities and provides training.

This bill provides for Prevailing Wage for underground utility projects.

An Act amending the act of June 9, 1936 (Sp.Sess.1, P.L.13, No.4), entitled "An act imposing an emergency State tax on liquor, as herein defined, sold by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the collection and payment of such tax; and imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue and the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board," further providing for emergency tax on liquors and amount of tax and collection. (Representatives BENHAM, MADDEN, SANCHEZ and others) - **Rules, June 28, 2023** **6**

OVER

This bill creates a grant program to provide financial support for municipalities that are in the greatest need of additional public safety measures and violent crime reduction efforts respective of their high concentration of liquor licenses.

Edward L. Shannon Memorial Highway; designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 13617, carrying Pennsylvania Route 34, over Mountain Creek in Mount Holly Springs Borough, Cumberland County, as the Firefighter Jerome Guise Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 8553, carrying State Route 1006 on Syberton Road over Clearfield Creek in Gallitzin Township, Cambria County, as the Private Martin J. Hanlon Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 36247, carrying Pennsylvania Route 711 over Loyalhanna Creek in Ligonier Township, Westmoreland County, as the Sergeant Alvin P. Carey and Private John C. Ewing Medal of Honor Memorial Bridge; designating the bridge, identified as Bridge Keys 34474 and 34477, carrying Interstate 70 over Pennsylvania Route 18, on the border of Washington City and Canton Township, Washington County, as the Corporal Frank Sworden Memorial Bridge; designating a portion of Pennsylvania Route 310 between Knox Dale Road, also known as State Route 2023, and Ash Street in McCalmont Township, Jefferson County,
