### SECOND CONSIDERATION HUMAN SERVICES BILL

HOUSE 931

An Act amending Title 67 (Public Welfare) of the Pennsylvania
Consolidated Statutes, in family finding and kinship care, establishing the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program and the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program Account; and making a transfer. (Representatives PASHINSKI, SANCHEZ, HILL-EVANS and others) - Human Services, June 12, 2023

This bill amends Title 67 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes to establish the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program and the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program Account.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 1742

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in employees, providing for ballistic armor for law enforcement officers. (Representatives A. BROWN, BRENNAN, ROZZI and others) - Rules, June 28, 2023

This bill requires police to wear ballistic body armor for protection during high risk law enforcement activities and provides training.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

**836** 

An Act amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in employees, further providing for definitions and for powers and duties of commission. (Senators FARRY, SCHWANK, REGAN and others) – Judiciary, July, 7, 2023

This bill provides comprehensive probation reform.

**SENATE 838** 

993

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for order of probation, for conditions of probation and for modification or revocation of order of probation and providing for probation review conference. (Senators BAKER, BARTOLOTTA, A. WILLIAMS and others) – Judiciary, July 11, 2023

This bill provides for the Municipal Police officers' Education and Training Commission.

## SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE 1465 1649

An Act providing for minimum wage standards in underground infrastructure work, for application of Prevailing Wage Act, for enforcement, for penalties and appeals and for protection from retaliation; and creating a private right of action. (Representatives DELLOSO, MADDEN, McNEILL and others) - Rules, June 29, 2023

This bill provides for Prevailing Wage for underground utility projects.

### SECOND CONSIDERATION LIQUOR CONTROL BILL

HOUSE

1252 1688

An Act amending the act of June 9, 1936 (Sp.Sess.1, P.L.13, No.4), entitled "An act imposing an emergency State tax on liquor, as herein defined, sold by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the collection and payment of such tax; and imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue and the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board," further providing for emergency tax on liquors and amount of tax and collection. (Representatives BENHAM, MADDEN, SANCHEZ and others) – Rules, June 28, 2023

This bill creates a grant program to provide financial support for municipalities that are in the greatest need of additional public safety measures and violent crime reduction efforts respective of their high concentration of liquor licenses.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION **LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILLS**

**HOUSE 123** 

An Act amending the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.805, No.247), known as the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, in 1593 subdivision and land development, providing for signage on subdivision or land development. (Representatives CIRESI, SAPPEY, SCHLOSSBERG and others) - Rules, June 30, 2023

This bill provides for signage on subdivision or land development.

HOUSE 1303

An Act amending Title 11 (Cities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in mayor, further providing for execution of 1429 laws, powers of sheriff conferred and emergency powers. (Representatives SIEGEL, HILL-EVANS, SCHLOSSBERG and others) - Rules, June 28, 2023

This bill would amend the Third Class City Code to update the emergency powers provisions pertaining to the length of the duration of a declared emergency by the mayor.

#### SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

**SENATE 621** 

An Act designating the portion of Pennsylvania Route 41 (Gap Newport Pike) from the intersection with Bernard Avenue to the 965 intersection with Highland Road in West Fallowfield Township, Chester County, as the Corporal Brandon Hardy Memorial Highway; designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 13775, carrying Pennsylvania Route 641 over Big Spring Creek on the border of Newville Borough and West Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, as the SFC Randall Shughart Memorial Bridge; designating a portion of Johnson Mill Road (State Route 1001) from the bridge over Buffalo Creek (Bridge Key 33467) to the intersection of Colonel John Kelly Road (State Route 1002) in Buffalo Township, Union County, as the Sgt. Edward L. Shannon Memorial Highway; designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 13617, carrying Pennsylvania Route 34, over Mountain Creek in Mount Holly Springs Borough, Cumberland County, as the Firefighter Jerome Guise Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 8553, carrying State Route 1006 on Syberton Road over Clearfield Creek in Gallitzin Township, Cambria County, as the Private Martin J. Hanlon Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 36247, carrying Pennsylvania Route 711 over Loyalhanna Creek in Ligonier Township, Westmoreland County, as the Sergeant Alvin P. Carey and Private John C. Ewing Medal of Honor Memorial Bridge; designating the bridge, identified as Bridge Keys 34474 and 34477, carrying Interstate 70 over Pennsylvania Route 18, on the border of Washington City and Canton Township, Washington County, as the Corporal Frank Sworden Memorial Bridge; designating a portion of Pennsylvania Route 310 between Knox Dale Road, also known as State Route 2023, and Ash Street in McCalmont Township, Jefferson County,

as the Lance Cpl. Bernard Himes Memorial Highway: and designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 33758, carrying Pennsylvania Route 427 over Sugar Creek in Sugarcreek Borough, Venango County, as the Staff Sergeant Richard James Mulholland Memorial Bridge. (Senators COMITTA, KANE, BREWSTER and others) - Transportation, July 7, 2023

This bill designates multiple roads and bridges in the Commonwealth.

#### THIRD CONSIDERATION AND FINAL PASSAGE NON-PREFERRED APPROPRIATION BILL

HOUSE 1456

A Supplement to the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations, for a method of accounting for the funds appropriated and for certain fiscal information disclosure; and making an appropriation from a restricted account within the Agricultural College Land Scrip Fund. (Representative HARRIS) - Appropriations, June 26, **Fiscal-Note Attached** 

This bill makes non-preferred appropriations to the Pennsylvania State University.
