SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN & YOUTH BILLS

HOUSE 2742

An Act amending Titles 23 (Domestic Relations) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in proceedings prior to petition to adopt, further providing for grounds for involuntary termination; and, in juvenile matters, further providing for disposition of dependent child. (Representatives KRAJEWSKI, KINSEY, CONKLIN and others) - Children & Youth, March 27, 2024

OVER

This bill provides for grounds for involuntary termination in juvenile matters.

HOUSE 1593

An Act amending the act of December 19, 1990 (P.L.1372, No.212), known as the Early Intervention Services System Act, further providing for title of the act; in general provisions, further providing for legislative findings for early intervention, for definitions, for State interagency agreement, for other duties of State agencies and for council; in Statewide system for provision of early intervention services, further providing for requirements, for program regulations and standards, for administration by Department of Public Welfare, for administration by Department of Education and for child identification, assessment and tracking system; in miscellaneous provisions, further providing for effective date; and making editorial changes. (Representatives OTTEN, BULLOCK, MADDEN and others) - Children & Youth, April 08, 2024

VOTE

This bill amends the Early Intervention Services System Act.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CONSUMER PROTECTION, TECHNOLOGY AND UTILITIES BILLS

HOUSE 1598 2791

An Act amending the act of December 17, 1968 (P.L.1224, No.387), known as the Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law, further providing for definitions and for unlawful acts or practices and exclusions. (Representatives PIELLI, MERSKI, O'MARA and others) – Consumer Protection, Technology & Utilities, April 9, 2024



This bill provides for notification of content generated by Artificial Intelligence.

HOUSE 2017

An Act amending Title 50 (Mental Health) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for protection of minors on social media; and imposing penalties. (Representatives MUNROE, DONAHUE, BOROWSKI and others) - Consumer Protection, Technology & Utilities, March 25, 2024

OVER

This bill amends Title 50 to provide protections for minors using social media and imposing penalties.

SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILL

HOUSE 1743 2112

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school directors, further providing for school director training programs. (Representatives MADDEN, PROBST, HILL-EVANS and others) - Education, January 2, 2024

OVER

This bill enhances and makes more efficient the training of elected school board officials.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HUMAN SERVICES BILL

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 67 (Public Welfare) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in family finding and kinship care, establishing the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program and the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program Account; and making a transfer. (Representatives PASHINSKI, SANCHEZ, HILL-EVANS and others) – Human Services, December 10, 2023

OVER

This bill amends Title 67 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes to establish the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program and the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program Account.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **INSURANCE BILL**

HOUSE 1512

An Act amending Title 40 (Insurance) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in regulation of insurers and related persons 2786 generally, providing for telemedicine. (Representatives SAPPEY, HILL-EVANS, HANBIDGE and others) - Insurance, April 08, 2024



This bill provides for health insurance coverage of telemedicine.

SECOND CONSIDERATION JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 587

An Act amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, repealing provisions relating to transfer of inmates in need of medical treatment; in Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, providing for parole for reasons of age or illness and for medical parole due to public or disaster emergency related to health or contagious disease outbreak; and abrogating regulations. (Representatives KINSEY, BURGOS, CURRY and

OVER

This bill amends Title 42 to create a medical parole process to allow incarcerated individuals with serious medical conditions including terminal illness to apply for release.

HOUSE

1441

An Act amending the act of April 6, 1951 (P.L.69, No.20), known as The Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951, providing for tenants' 1625 rights in cases of violence. (Representatives BOROWSKI, SCHLOSSBERG, KINSEY and others) - Judiciary, December 12, 2023

OVER

This bill amends the Landlord Tenant Act to allow victims of domestic violence to change locks or terminate a lease.

SENATE

An Act amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further providing for definitions and for sexual offenses and tier system. (Senators BAKER, YAW, K. WARD and others) - Judiciary, April 9, 2024

This bill requires individuals who are convicted of inchoate crimes related to human trafficking offenses to register under the Sexual Offender Registration and Notification Act.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE 1834

An Act amending the act of June 19, 2018 (P.L.229, No.36), known as the Employment First Act, further providing for 2414 Employment First Oversight Commission. (Representatives D. MILLER, CUTLER, MADDEN and others) - Labor & Industry, April 08, 2024

 \mathbf{VOTE}

This bill creates an office of the Executive Director within the Employment First Oversight Commission.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILLS

HOUSE 961

An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in preliminary provisions, providing for county property contact information list; imposing duties on chief assessors; and providing for penalties. (Representatives SOLOMON, MERSKI, SIEGEL and others) - Local Government, March 19, 2024

OVER

This bill amends Title 68 to require individuals and businesses to submit basic information to counties when purchasing real property within the county.

HOUSE

An Act providing for the redevelopment of historic and older buildings; and establishing the Historic and Older Building 2753 Redevelopment Assistance Grant Program and the Historic and Older Building Redevelopment Fund. (Representatives CIRESI, ROZZI, MADDEN and others) - Local Government, April 2024

VOTE

This bill establishes the Historic and Older Building Redevelopment Assistance Grant Program.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, providing for 2732 removal of vehicles in a city of the first class. (Representatives GIRAL, SANCHEZ, KINSEY and others) - Transportation, April 9, 2024



This bill amends Title 75 to provide for removal of vehicles in a city of the first class.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILLS

HOUSE 2055

An Act amending the act of June 22, 1931 (P.L.594, No.203), referred to as the Township State Highway Law, adding a route in Dauphin County. (Representatives MEHAFFIE, DALEY, GILLEN and others) - Transportation, April 9, 2024

VOTE

This bill amends the Township State Highway Law to transfer ownership of a route in Dauphin County.

THIRD CONSIDERATION AND FINAL PASSAGE JUDICIARY BILLS

HOUSE 1371

An Act providing for duties of certifying officials and certifying agencies regarding the processing of certification form petitions. (Representatives HOHENSTEIN, MIHALEK, BURGOS and others) - Appropriations, March 26, 2024 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill provides certifying agencies with clarity and consistency for providing nonimmigrant victims with documentation to use when applying for a U Visa.

HOUSE 1410 1578

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for pardoning power and Board of Pardons. (Representatives McCLINTON, KINSEY, WAXMAN and others) - Appropriations, December 12, 2023 Fiscal-Note Attached

OVER

This bill proposes to amend the Constitution to return to the pre "tough on crime era" requirement that a 3 of 5 vote, rather than unanimous vote, of the Board of Pardons is needed to make a person eligible for pardon or commutation by the Governor.
